### PROVISIONS REVIEWED

Kentucky's new probation law, sting in Circuit Judges the power probating, under certain condions, sentences below that of dea'n life imprisonment, became effect-

Commenting upon the new law, ircuit Judge John W. Caudill Monlay indicated his approval of parts of the act and his disapproval of other parts. "It gives judges too much power." he said. "If all were conscientious and made every effort to do the right thing, it would fulfill its purpose and be altogether all

Salient points in the new law fol-

Except in verdicts providing the death penalty or life imprisonment, the Circuit Judge may postpone entering of judgment and sentencing fendant on probation, or may impose a fine and also place the defendant on probation.






