





School uniforms hung up, for now

In a rare Saturday morning meeting, the Floyd County Board of Education met in special session at Adams Middle School to address items that will have an impact on schools for next year, including school uniforms, pay schedules and proposed improvements to school properties.

The board may have chosen Saturday for this meeting because four evenings (Monday through Thursday) this week are being devoted to interviewing candi-

dates for superintendent. A new superintendent is scheduled to be hired as early as next week.

Board chairman Terry Dotson said the board is considering the idea of more Saturday meetings when special-called sessions are necessary.

Interim Superintendent Woody Carter provided the board with additional information on school uniforms. This item was brought up at an earlier meeting and was tabled because board members

Adkins charged with cocaine trafficking


Among the wad of bills confiscated at a Branham's Creek residence Monday evening was a personal check for \$100.

Floyd County Sheriff's Deputy Ricky Thornsberry said it is not unusual to find checks when stash is taken from suspected drug dealers, illustrating the everyday retail aspects of the drug trade.

Thornsberry and Sheriff John K. Blackburn took around \$300 worth of cocaine, wrapped in six individual packets, and about \$673 in cash (and check) from the residence of George Adkins, 51, of KY 3379 at Grethel.

They also confiscated a bag of marijuana, amounting to less than eight ounces, two guns, a telephone handset and more than a dozen bottles of prescription drugs, most of them originating from the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Huntington.

Waste group questions coal landfill proposal

Floyd County's Solid Waste Commission plans to ask representatives of Lodestar Energy of Pikeville to present their proposal for a coal byproducts landfill at Ivel to the local Fiscal Court.

Solid Waste coordinator Mike Vance said he will give Lodestar officials a copy of a resolution from the commission and ask them to appear before the Fiscal Court at its June 18 meeting.

"They could probably ignore

(the resolution), but we ought to ask them," Vance said during Monday night's commission meeting.

Commission members contend Lodestar — and the state — have bypassed the county's solid waste plan which calls for no new waste facilities during the time of the plan, which runs through 2002.

Vance said he talked with officials of the state Division of Waste Management Monday and they claimed Lodestar's application is

RN union vote upheld

The National Labor Relations Board has determined an election by registered nurses at Highlands Regional Medical Center in March in favor of the union.

The hospital's objections to the election were "tossed out," according to a spokesperson for the Service Employees International Union/1199.

At the time of the March 25 election, 45 nurses voted in favor of the union, 45 voted against, two ballots were challenged, and the votes of 17 operating room nurses

were not included in the tally.

An HRMC spokesperson said yesterday that the hospital "will consider whether it is in its best interest to pursue further legal remedies in opposition to the NLRB's decision."

She said HRMC "maintains its position that the majority of registered nurses do not want representation and (the hospital) has a responsibility to recognize the concerns of those who voted against representation."

Allen leaders reconsider budget

Even though the council passed the tentative budget that Mayor Sharon Woods and City Clerk Bill Parsons presented at Monday night's Allen City Council meeting, it will have to be amended to finance other items that were requested at the meeting.

The 1999-2000 estimated budget has a total revenue of \$79,150 and \$20,650 balance from last year for a total of \$99,800.

Other than the normal expenses for running a city, the budget calls for \$3,500 for street signs; \$4,000 for street maintenance; and \$5,500 for street lights, plus a contingency fund of \$5,000.

Clyde Woods, assistant police chief, requested that the city buy two radar units and two night sticks for the police department. The council approved the purchase of these items.

Then Woods pointed out to the council that Virgil Conn is using his own vehicles to perform city police work. Woods contends that the minute the car is used for police work, the private insurance that Conn has on the vehicles is invalid.

Woods said he would like to see the city transfer Conn's vehicle into the city with Conn as lien holder. Parsons said he saw the need for the request but reminded the council that insurance is a costly item. He said the budget would have to be redone and, hopefully, he could find additional revenue.

Mayor Woods was charged with calling for insurance quotes, and city attorney Stacy Marshall said he would look into possible grants to purchase cruisers for the city.

Clyde Woods also requested that the city look into using prisoners from Otter Creek and the Floyd County Detention Center to do cleanup work in the city. Marshall said Otter Creek would need a list

of items that would need to be done so the correction facility would know what personnel to send.

The council agreed that cleaning the creek banks was a much-needed project. Marshall said he thought this work could be done legally even though the land is on private property as long as permission is granted by the landowner.

Marshall also advised the council to work closely with Floyd County Fiscal Court because the county can assist in hauling off the garbage once it is collected.

At the last meeting the council had requested that a one-way-street sign be moved. Parsons said there was no way to move the sign unless Troy Conn's fence was moved.

Marshall reminded everyone that no blacktop would be replaced until the water and sewage projects are completed.

All members were present, except Larry Castle.

Election expensive for county

The May 25 primary election, with its extremely low turnout, cost Floyd county about \$13 a vote.

That's what the Fiscal Court has to pay to compensate all the election workers who were required to be on duty and for the polling places for the election in which only about 1,700 voters bothered to cast a ballot.

At a special-called meeting Friday afternoon, the county commissioners approved payment of bills totaling around \$22,000 for the not-so-hotly contested election which drew a ho-hum reaction all over the state.

But, according to County Clerk Chris Waugh, who is in charge of elections, the polling places had to be secured and a full roster of election officers employed just as with any other election.

The fiscal court also agreed to pay \$13,795 for a sliding board for the county-owned Wheelwright Swimming Pool. Chester Pools submitted the only bid for the slide. Judge-Executive Paul Hunt

Thompson said the bid included installation of the slide and that a company official said the slide might be in place by July 4.

The county will contribute \$4,000 toward the cost of the fireworks show to be put on by the City of Prestonsburg at Archer Park on July 3, the commissioners decided, Thompson said the contribution was appropriate since "the entire county benefits from the fireworks."

The hiring of Clyde Woods as manager of the Allen Golf Course was approved. Woods has been serving as temporary manager since the middle of April. His hourly rate, effective June 5, is \$10.73.

Four more persons were employed for summer work at the hourly rate of \$5.15. Jonathan Paul Newman was hired to work on the John M. Stumbo Park at Mud Creek. Thompson explained that he was "trying to develop a park if we can get them out of the swamp," referring to creek cleanup efforts in the area.

Also hired for the parks department was Jackie Owens II who is

scheduled to work on the ballfields at Allen Park. Working with the road department will be summer employees Brandon Jarrell and Seth Crisp.

The fiscal court voted to rescind a resolution adopted at the regular meeting in May in which commissioners gave the judge-executive the authority to advertise for bids to sell surplus equipment. Thompson said he had found a trade for a "junk" loader.

Commissioners Larry Foster Stumbo and Ernal Tackett were present for the special meeting. The next regularly scheduled meeting is Friday, June 18, at 10 a.m.

for a special waste facility, not a solid waste facility.

Vance said he also was told that it was the county's or the commission's responsibility to make Lodestar aware of local landfill application procedures, which include a notice to the commission and a public hearing by the Fiscal Court.

The question becomes, commission members pointed out, how could the commission inform the mining company of local procedures before it knew an application for a landfill had been filed by Lodestar.

The commissioners also questioned the fact that the landfill application was only available for review at the Frankfort office of the Division of Waste Management. They said Floyd Countians should be able to review it locally.

A news release given out last week by the Division contained scant details about the application by Lodestar for a waste landfill, and it was in error concerning the location.

The application, although listing an Ivy Creek Road location, describes the landfill site as being adjacent to Lodestar's present Stratton Branch landfill on the west side of the Levisa Fork, south of Ivy Creek.

A geologist at the Division of Waste Management told a representative of the Kentucky Press Association that the old landfill, which has been in existence for five or six years is running out of space. The new one would be called the Tom Hollow Ash Fill, according to the application.

The geologist, David Jackson, said the ash to be deposited in the landfill is from coal that Lodestar (formerly Costain) mines and ships to a Florida power plant. The coal is burned there and the ash shipped back by the Cedar Bay Ash Facility to Lodestar for disposal.

Information on Lodestar's application for the landfill indicates that the maximum daily fill rate will be 822 tons, with an average daily rate of 658 tons. The site volume, over 16-1/2 years, is expected to be close to four million cubic yards.

The total area for the landfill site is listed as 66.89 acres, with 30.41 acres to be filled.

Members of the local Solid Waste Commission question the Division of Waste Management's requirement that all counties submit a solid waste plan and then its ignoring of the county's plan in accepting the mining company application, essentially circumventing the local process.

"If we hadn't submitted our plan, we could be fined so much each day," said Barney Walker, "but then the state ignores it."

In its resolution, the commission asks that the Fiscal Court join it in requesting the Division of Waste Management to deem the application incomplete until the coal company follows the county's waste management plan.

In other commission business, Vance gave an update on the closing of the Floyd County landfill. He said agents of the Division of Waste Management and Abandoned Mine Lands have

looked at the landfill and are still debating whether it is on the site of old underground coal mines.

He said the county has done everything it was required to do, but an inordinate amount of water keeps seeping up through what he thinks are old auger holes. "We're trying to prove the auger holes were in there (from old mining)," he said, "and (the Division) is still trying to hold us to deadlines."

"We'd hate to put a cap on and then have to go back in because of the (seepage from) the holes," Vance said.

Cleanup totals

The coordinator also reported tallies from the countywide cleanup in the spring. More than 1,500 tons of garbage was turned into the transfer station at Garth during the five-week cleanup, 65 percent of which was brought in by residents themselves and the rest by county crews picking up large items at the request of residents.

Vance reported, too, that some 300 tons of metal was collected, including old appliances, and resold. He emphasized that old appliances and "any kind of metal" can be taken to the transfer station and deposited at no charge.

"If you don't start fining people, the cleanup doesn't do any good," said Lowell Samons.

Vance said he had stopped several people for littering and had given them the option to pick up in the area where they had littered, which all of them did.



wanted more time to study the issue.

During Saturday's meeting, board members told Carter that the county was not ready for uniforms but agreed to keep the dialogue open for future discussion.

Board member Carol Stumbo cited three reasons not to have uniforms: "Schools don't want them, there is no proof they make a difference and the system should first enforce the code now in place."

Board member Jody Mullins said the board should put some "teeth" in the dress code and added that society blames many things for student behavior but he thought things began to deteriorate "when the paddle and prayer were taken out of the schools."

A committee of family resource personnel did a survey on parent reaction to school uniforms. To the question, "Are you in favor of school uniforms?" 851 answered yes and 2,251 answered no. To the question, "Will you be in a financial position to purchase three pairs of pants and three shirts (estimated cost \$125-150)?" 1,015 answered yes and 1,963 answered no.

Board member Johnnie Ross said if the board should choose to go with uniforms, it should provide additional money to the family resource centers to help needy families purchase uniforms.

Employee pay

The salary schedule for next year calls for a state-mandated 2.3 percent increase for certified and classified staff. A teacher at the high end of the pay scale (Rank I with 20 or more years of service) will be making \$41,712, while a beginning teacher with a BA or BS will be making \$25,809.

Certified staff members have not received any raise above the state-mandated amount since 1989, the year of the strike.

The board approved compensation for those 260-day classified employees affected by changing from a 260-day work year to a 240-day year.

Carter will poll all 260-day classified employees and give them the choice of taking additional days off in 1999-2000 or being paid their daily rate for the vacation they earned in 1998-99. Payment for these days can be made in two lump sums (1/2 in July 1999 and 1/2 in December 1999 or 1/2 in December 1999 and 1/2 in June 2000) as agreed upon by the employees and the finance director.

Utilities

The board approved payment of \$40,000 to Prestonsburg Utilities to hook Clark Elementary to the city's sewage system which is being extended from Salley Stephens Branch, along the Mountain Parkway (KY 114) and along KY 404 to include the community of David.

Both the high school and elementary school in the city of Prestonsburg use the sewage system.

In a reply to a letter from Carter, superintendent of the utilities company Seldon Horne said the purpose of the project is "to eliminate as many straight pipes, failing septic systems and package treatment plants as possible."

The board also approved accepting the low bid of \$77,000 from Martin Engineering to replace the waste water treatment plant at Osborne Elementary.

Summer program

The board gave approval to Big Sandy Community Action Program (CAP) of Paintsville to administer the Summer Youth Employment Training Program ((SYETP).

The program will employ 150-200 high school students to perform work at the 14 Floyd County schools. The program will begin on June 21 and run through the month

of July.

Stumbo said in the past there have been instances of students doing "more damage than work." Jim Stewart, who will be coordinating the project for CAP, said there will be good control with three levels of supervision to see that this does not happen.

Other Items

Despite a request from Stumbo to wait until after the new superintendent is in office, the board approved the creation of two new certified central office positions: director of elementary education and coordinator of special education.

Carter said the plan is to go from the present north team/south team concept to a four-tier plan: elementary, middle, high and special education leaders.

Carter said this would permit each leader to be more focused in his/her area of responsibility.

Both Stumbo and Ross voted no on this proposal.

The board approved \$456,767.86 to be placed in the Kentucky Education Technology System (KEGS) as matching funds. These funds will allow for the continuation and implementation of new computer purchases for every classroom toward the goal of 6:1 student ratio, new and updated software packages for instruction, management and attendance and completion of the district's e-mail communication system, voice system and Internet resources for every classroom.

Stumbo said purchasing technology is not enough. She said there must be professional development on the technology followed up by implementation. Carter assured

Stumbo that both facets of her request would be monitored closely.

Earlier in the year, an account for over \$100,000 was found at Star Bank. The board voted to move the funds to Community Trust Bank where the board's other accounts are held. Stumbo said she and the board should know the origin of this account and that Associate Commissioner of Education Tom Willis has this information and should share it with the board.

Board attorney Mike Schmitt drew up a memorandum of agreement with The David School. The agreement calls for The David School to instruct Floyd County GED students at selected sites in the county. Mullins said he has heard that David would drop a class if a certain level of attendance was not maintained. The board gave Carter latitude to work out the details with the private school.

At the last meeting, the board decided to wait for bids on insurance rather than renewing last year's contract. It appears the board may have saved money by this action. The board approved an insurance package with Zurich Insurance Company, offered through Hatton-Allen Insurance, at a cost of \$508,605. The board approved the package with the understanding that Schmitt would have time to study the policy and the board would have the option to acquire higher coverage in certain areas.

The board approved a contract

with the Department of Juvenile Justice to provide educational services for youth housed at the Big Sandy Juvenile Detention Center. A new regulation states that the district in which a facility is located must provide educational services.

At the present time only three of the nine students are from Floyd County. However, Floyd County is responsible for providing services to all nine.

Sharon Jarvis, director of food

services, provided the board with a complete equipment replacement plan through 2001. The board had asked for this information at an earlier meeting.

In other items the board approved the following items:

- A food service agreement with Mountain Comprehensive Care;
- Use of South Floyd High School facilities by Clear Creek Church;
- Use of Wheelwright gym by

Dream Machine;

- Use of McDowell Elementary facilities by Class of 1979 and 1989 reunions on September 4 and July 3;
- Field trip waiver for South Floyd High School;
- The letting of bids on the school property at Drift;
- Kentucky Department of Education community education grant.





Adkins was charged with trafficking in cocaine, a Class D felony, possession of marijuana and possession of controlled substances. He was lodged in the Floyd County Detention Center.

The sheriff's office also reports the arrest last Wednesday of a Hueysville man on charges of marijuana cultivation. Bertle Bailey, 21, was allegedly growing the illegal plants in pots in his yard "in plain sight," according to Thornsberry. Since more than five plants were involved, the charge is a Class D felony.

Editorial

Dr. Deborah Floyd has announced she is retiring as president of Prestonsburg Community College as of November, but she will begin a sabbatical leave in July that will essentially take her away from the campus then.

If what we know about human nature and about eastern Kentucky is any kind of evidence, more than a few persons are already jockeying for position either to win the title for themselves or to have a strong voice in the selection of the new leadership.

TIME TO HEAL

Dr. Floyd has brought to the college some good ideas and the honest desire to lead progressively. She has emphasized healthful living in a region that partially defines itself by lard and lying around. She has been relentless in her efforts to upgrade the campus. She has succeeded in broadening the cultural identity of the college in an area that could be defined largely as "white bread."

She is, however, leaving a minefield of human relations disasters. Distrust, backbiting, rumormongering and pettiness have replaced collegiality. The recent state auditor's report characterized the campus as "polarized," meaning the dissenting parties are literally poles apart.

We cannot say for sure what led to the situation Dr. Floyd is leaving. We know, for a fact, that this a very difficult place for women to lead. We hear all of our lives about the "mountain mama" who holds families together and has the strength to conquer all manner of problems, but we don't much like letting her out of the house.

We also know, for a fact, that some very capable people have left the college earlier than they would have otherwise and that many who have remained are deeply demoralized. We know, too, that some persons' lives have been damaged and all but destroyed in a milieu of hatefulness and oneupsmanship.

It is now up to the powers-that-be at the Kentucky Community and Technical College System to pick an interim president to serve while a formal search is conducted for Dr. Floyd's replacement. That interim leader, we would think, will have to step in very soon, since Dr. Floyd is committed to enroll in a program at Harvard University next month.

We would be so bold as to advise the KCTCS leadership to choose an interim president from outside PCC. The atmosphere is far too contentious for a current staff member to be accepted or to lead with any possibility of success.

The interim needs to be a healer, a person who will come in with no prior ties to the situation and whose anointed hand will sooth past slights. He needs to be a person whose character cultivates trust and confidence, one who can make tough decisions based on fairness, intelligence and sensitivity, one who can build consensus and one who can rebuild an atmosphere of collegiality as it should exist at a place where education is the stated purpose.

Certainly, the appointment of an interim president should not be taken lightly. Prestonsburg Community College is extremely important to this region. We need it to be strong, vital, credible and a source of pride. We want it to be all that it can be. Don't shortchange us.

A leap forward for genealogy

A human family tree has branches stretching back into the dim past. People who want to inspect the interconnections of those branches up close — genealogists — now have an exceptional new resource.

Members of the Mormon Church travel the world to research their ancestors and other people as part of their religious practice. The church has been gathering data for a century and has assembled an

archive of genealogical data second to none, with information on two billion people from all over the world.

Recently, church officials inaugurated a Web site, www.familysearch.org, that contains information on 400 million of those people. In the next two years, the church expects to add another 600 million names from 110 countries.

The collection of names is an awesome accomplishment in itself,

but the treasure of information it opens to genealogical researchers is priceless.

The listing encourages a sense of continuity and connectedness in the human beings who are alive today.

Each man, woman and child has two parents, four grandparents, eight great-grandparents, 16 great-great-grandparents and on and on. Each ancestor is an individual who slept and ate, talked with friends,

felt the sunshine and perhaps even thought about his ancestors, too. People are connected with others in ways they can only imagine.

The trace of life begins with each individual and stretches into history, each person building on the genes and the past of the people who produced him. The family of man is enormous, both in its numbers and complexity.

If the Mormon Church's archive can stir an interest in the past, if users can get a hint of the wonderful diversity of the human species, then it will have fulfilled more than its genealogical purpose. It will have helped connect people with the richness and depth of their heritage as human beings.

"OLD GLORY" HONORED JUNE 14

Editor:

June 14 is Flag Day. It's the day our nation sets aside to pay special honor to the American flag and its role in our country's history.

I have been fortunate to travel extensively in the past nine months. My travels have taken me across our nation and to several foreign lands, no matter where I find myself, I can look out of a window and somewhere in my field of view will be an American flag. That makes me proud and always brings me a sense of well being.

Two weeks ago I was in Indianapolis for the dedication of the only memorial in our nation to recipients of the Medal of Honor. During the impressive ceremony, the backdrop was a panorama of American flags held proudly by veterans, Scouts, members of the military and other patriotic organizations.

During the dedication ceremony, the president of the Medal of Honor Society, Paul Bucha, told a crowd of thousands that the American flag was much more than a mere piece of cloth. Our flag is the hope of the world and the solemn cover that drapes the caskets of the nation's fallen heroes.

I find it ironic that for 10 consecutive Flag Days the American people have joined together to celebrate the lessons of "Old Glory" while simultaneously toiling to return to us the right to protect the American flag from physical desecration. That protection was stolen from us by a 1989 Supreme Court decision.

The American people, Congress and the President quickly reacted to that decision and passed a law—a simple statute—to protect the American flag. The Supreme Court overturned the law. In doing so, the court told Americans a simple statute would not work and the only way to return protection to the American

flag was through a constitutional amendment.

Today, a decade later, we are still fighting to regain the people's right to protect the American flag. Polling over the decade has remained constant: nearly 80 percent of Americans favor an amendment. Forty-nine state legislatures have passed resolutions petitioning Congress to pass the amendment and send it to the states for ratification.

Why then are we still fighting for this right? Why has the House twice overwhelmingly passed the amendment only to have it defeated by a few votes in the U.S. Senate? Why do some Senators continue to propose a statute when they know it won't work?

The answer seems simple to me: We the people are not holding our elected officials accountable for their actions. We believe we elect our lawmakers to represent the majority of their constituents, but they don't. That's the real tragedy.

Look around you this Flag Day. Drink in the beauty of "Old Glory" waving proudly. Remember the grade school lessons reinforced by the number of stars and stripes. Remember the story of Francis Scott Key and the writing of "The Star-Spangled Banner." Recall the scene of "Old Glory" being raised on Mount Surabaci.


And take pride in the lump in your throat that comes with the realization that our American flag is much more than a symbol or a piece of cloth.

On Flag Day, let's honor "Old Glory" as never before. Then call our senators and urge them to do the right thing and vote for a constitutional amendment to return to us the right to protect our flag. I don't believe that's too much to ask of every citizen.




Bank appreciation


Cyrus produced a 30-second radio spot for the Kentucky Circuit Court Clerks' Trust For Life that is being aired on more than 60 country music radio stations across the

Medicaid in Kentucky: How well is it working?

One Kentuckian put it this way: "I think Medicaid is wonderful. If it had not been for Medicaid, I could never have made it, because I can't afford any kind of insurance. Medicaid is the only thing that made it possible to pay my bills; without Medicaid, I would be dead."

This was one of the 5,000 responses from Medicaid recipients in Kentucky who returned a survey on their level of satisfaction with this program.

The survey was developed by the University of Kentucky's Martin School of Public Policy and Administration and sent to randomly selected Medicaid recipients in

1997. The typical reaction to the survey, according to Jeff Talbert, one of the researchers on the project, was satisfaction. "The results of the baseline survey revealed an overall satisfaction with Medicaid across the state," says Talbert, an assistant professor in the Martin School.

"In fact, more than 60 percent of Medicaid recipients reported being very satisfied with Medicaid."

This base-line survey was important, the researchers say, to get an accurate idea of how people liked the "old" system of Medicaid in order to compare these findings with those from future surveys on Medicaid satisfaction. The new sys-

tem is already in place in some areas of Kentucky.

What makes the system new isn't so much its philosophy of care, but is rather the result of one of the oldest conflicts in the nation: federal versus state responsibility and control.

"It's not a dramatically different program, but what's different in Kentucky and a lot of other states is that the states have demanded more control of how medical care is to be supplied for those who qualify for Medicaid," says Greg Hager, a UK assistant professor of political science who co-directed this project.

Previously in Kentucky, Medicaid operated as a federal-state

partnership, each supplying money to keep the system going. But it's been an unequal partnership: the federal government laid down all the ground rules for the system, dictating, for example, eligibility requirements for Medicaid.

"So the federal government could expand the pool of people eligible, and the states had to, in effect, just cough up the additional money," Hager says.

As the price tag for Medicaid rose like an unchecked fever in most state budgets—Medicaid is now the largest item in Kentucky's state budget, with an annual price tag of about \$2.5 billion—governors have begun to insist that they have more say in how these considerable state funds are being spent.

One significant change in parts of Kentucky is the move away from a standard "fee-for-service" system. Under the old rules, any hospital in the state that accepted Medicaid patients charged the same fee for a particular service.

Someone seeing a doctor because of a bad cough was charged the same no matter how long the appointment took or how many tests were run.

"What we're seeing now is more of an HMO-like situation," Hager says, "where companies bid, agreeing to provide a long list of doctors and types of medical care for Medicaid patients."

"The HMOs have an incentive to emphasize more preventive care since it's obviously cheaper for them to work on preventive health

care with someone than pay thousands of dollars for a heart-bypass surgery later on," Hager says.

"Clearly, an HMO is interested in doing what they can to encourage people to come in for regular check-ups, which would result in a healthier population of Medicaid users."

Kick-off for second phase of KCHIP set

Country music superstar Naomi Judd will help kick off Phase II of the Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP) at the Civic Center in Frankfort on Wednesday, June 23, at 10 a.m.

Judd, a Kentucky native and former nurse, will unveil the public awareness campaign designed to encourage eligible families to apply for free health coverage for their children. Participants at the event will be trained to distribute information, identify eligible children and help families apply.

For those unable to attend the Frankfort gathering, regional meetings will be linked to Frankfort by satellite at the same time. Those meetings will be in Ashland, Hazard, Somerset, Bowling Green, Owensboro, Paducah and Northern Kentucky. Naomi Judd and her daughter, actress Ashley Judd, will appear in television and radio commercials promoting KCHIP and prompting families to apply.

Starting July 1, KCHIP will provide free health insurance to uninsured children in families with incomes under 150 percent of the federal poverty level—\$25,050 a year for a family of four. An estimated 100,000 children in Kentucky are in this category.

Last July, KCHIP coverage was offered to teens, ages 14 through 18, who live in families with incomes below 100 percent of poverty—\$16,700 a year for a family of four.

The Cabinet for Health

Services is heading up an aggressive outreach effort to make sure eligible families learn about KCHIP and apply for coverage. The cabinet is working with local health departments, health care providers, schools, family resource and youth services centers, the Cabinet for Families and Children and other interested groups and individuals.

Hiring kin: Good, bad, or who cares?

The question of nepotism — county officials hiring kinfolks — is being tossed to the Floyd County Fiscal Court for an answer.

The Floyd County Ethics Commission, meeting June 1, decided the section of the revised county ethics code that deals with the hiring of family members should be decided by the county commissioners, perhaps at their next meeting on June 18.

The ethics panel met with Judge-Executive Paul Hunt Thompson for almost three hours to discuss points in the ethics code. The only real bone of contention in the nine-page code, which was originally passed by the fiscal court last year, is the section on nepotism.

The first part of the nepotism section reads: "No county government officer, county government employee, or county government agency shall advocate, recommend, or cause the employment, appointment, promotion, transfer, or advancement of a family member to an office or position of employment with the county or county government agency."

Earlier in the code, family member is defined as a spouse, parent or child.

Thompson, emphasizing that he was speaking for himself and not

for the fiscal court, said he defines nepotism as hiring "a family member that's not qualified for the job."

"What I take that to mean is that if someone is qualified to do the job, that's not nepotism," said Thompson, whose wife, Donna, has been his assistant for several years, first while he was sheriff and in his present position.

Thompson avoided violating the nepotism section of the ethics code under a "grandfather" clause which waives the rule since Donna Thompson worked for him before the code went into effect.

"We have to try to set the standards," said Patty Murphy, a member of the Ethics Commission. "We have to ask if that person is given a job (because of family ties) or are there other applicants who are more qualified. It's a matter of making sure you have someone who's competent."

The judge-executive said he could "see (the rule) applying more to other offices, but not to fee offices." In those offices, where money is collected for the county — fee offices — "you need someone who will look out for your butt," Thompson said.

He referred, specifically, to a pending case in which the Ethics Commission ruled that Pam Blackburn would be in violation of the code if she continued to work for her husband, Floyd County Sheriff John K. Blackburn.

Pam Blackburn contends she was hired by Thompson when he was sheriff and not by her husband, and she has appealed to Floyd Circuit Court to remain in the job and receive back pay for the time she has already worked since January.

Thompson said that in a job such as sheriff, where large amounts of money are collected, the office holder needs to have someone he trusts and who has an interest in his success.

"My wife has stayed (on the job) until two in the morning to balance the books," he said, referring to his time as sheriff.

John Rosenberg, chairman of the Ethics Commission, said many people have expressed support of a strong nepotism rule in the code. "You don't know how many people have told me, 'Don't give up on this nepotism issue,'" Rosenberg said. "If you put this to a vote in the county, (the voters) would vote for this nepotism rule. The perception people have is it's another situation that's not fair."

"That's what they have been saying to me," said Peggy Bradford, also a commission member. The other members — Curtis Hall, Patty Murphy and John Richard Porter — agreed that they had heard only support of the nepotism rule.

"People want a code of ethics that can stand up," said Hall.

Rosenberg advised Thompson that the current ethics code will stay in effect unless the fiscal court votes to amend it.

"I think something has to be voted on by the fiscal court," Thompson said. "If it's our baby, we have to rock it."

"I would urge you not to change the current provision to weaken it," Rosenberg said to Thompson, "but it's really in your lap."

Asked if he would prefer unrestricted hiring of family members or a specific limitation, Thompson said he thought allowing one family member to work for an official was sufficient.

Thompson and Rosenberg agreed that a statewide ethics code would be desirable, instead of each county developing its own separate code.

"In some counties, everything's wide open, some are overly restrictive," Thompson said. "It would be simpler if the state would write (a code)."

Ethics Commission members also discussed elements of the financial disclosure section of the code with Thompson, but they were essentially in agreement. The commission acknowledged that parts of the disclosure form needed to be clarified or redesigned.

Rosenberg informed the group that attorney Jay Callis has agreed to represent the commission in the complaint filed by Pam Blackburn.



PCC meeting anything but routine

Dr. Chandra Varia appeared at last Thursday evening's meeting of the Prestonsburg Community College Board of Directors to speak on behalf of the Single Parent and Homemaker Program, which faces dwindling revenue and space.

But the timing was not right.

Board members listened to the Martin physician and then turned immediately to what was occupying their minds — the loss of the college's president and the highly critical audit released recently by the State Auditor's office.

Dr. Deborah Floyd, who would announce that evening that she was leaving for sabbatical study on July 1 and then retiring on November 1, read her reaction to the May 27 audit report (FCT, May 28), in which management of the college was criticized.

Floyd reminded the board that she had asked for a financial audit

because of suspected misuse of testing fee collections and that she had strengthened internal financial controls.

The audit turned into not just a financial examination, but also a management audit, which lasted for more than a month. The report alleged that Floyd had used employees to do personal work for her, that overtime pay was not adequately allotted and that the campus was "polarized," among other problems.

"... I question the need of an audit to address the climate of PCC as opposed to its fiscal policies and procedures," Floyd said Thursday.

"Climate studies have been performed at my request in 1996 and again in 1998. I doubt that the audit's remarks regarding personal disputes on campus is news to you and trust that you are as familiar with the climate at PCC as anyone," she said to the board.

Floyd denied using employees for personal work and added that employees have a responsibility not to be misused. "... I assert that each employee has a responsibility to make certain that no personal work whatsoever is performed during any time while the employee is 'on the clock' of the college."

When Floyd had concluded her

prepared statement, board member John Triplett presented a statement he wanted the board to make in which he recommended that business officer Michelle Meek be hired as Dean of Business Affairs, a position that has been in limbo since John Herald was reassigned to the Kentucky Community and Technical College System office at the onset of the audit.

Dr. Rodney Handshoe said he agreed with the intent of Triplett's statement, but he thought recommending Meek "may go beyond the scope of (the board's) responsibilities... I don't feel comfortable. We don't have a role in selecting people for the college."

Board Chairman Paul Gearheart and Board Member Emeritus Robert Conley said they both thought the recommendation went beyond the board's authority.

When the statement was rewritten to take out personnel references, to support the audit and implementation of its recommendations, and to "steadfastly" support Floyd, it was approved in a split vote. Triplett and board members Bob Hutchison, Frank Salisbury and Gary Thomas Underwood voted in favor; Gearheart and Handshoe voted against, and Sammy Chaney abstained.

That done, Floyd read from another prepared statement, in which she thanked the board "for your unwavering confidence in my leadership."

She said she thought she had stayed long enough at the college to honor her commitment when she was hired in 1992 to "make a difference," and she subsequently announced her retirement.

Board member Bob Hutchison then read from yet another prepared statement, this one a resolution "in recognition of Dr. Deborah L. Floyd's leadership ..."

The resolution, which was adopted by acclamation, states that "regardless of the many obstacles, Dr. Floyd's leadership has been dignified, professional and has set a positive example for the College and the Region."

It extolled Floyd for her work "with community leaders in developing extraordinary collaborative relationships with agencies, universities, colleges and government and (she) has promoted a 'community' where the campus library and facilities are open for use by others to extend the opportunities within the Big Sandy Region."

Specifically cited were her accomplishments in building the Riverwalk, establishing a student health clinic, lobbying for additional facilities and on behalf of students, and her personal monetary contributions.

The resolution requested that the University of Kentucky, KCTCS and communities in this region express "their formal appreciation to Dr. Floyd for her service."

It asked further that she be given the honorary title of President Emeritus and that "every consideration be given to naming a future building" for her, as was done in honor of the late Dr. Henry

Campbell, who retired in 1992 as founding president of the college after 27 years of service.

In the midst of the audit report and the resignation of the president, the PCC board took no action in regard to Dr. Chandra's remarks.

The doctor, who has personally supported the program which helps single parents get career counseling and education to help themselves, told the board, "I think it is our moral responsibility and obligation to support these women to have a place for them on this cam-

For the first time in four years someone else besides the Pikeville Lady Panthers will represent the 15th Region in the girls' state softball tournament at Owensboro next weekend.






Besides driving on the Winston Cup circuit, the role of crew chief has become the highest profile position found in the garage area. It may also be the toughest position to try and come up with a job description that totally explains what is expected from any individual wanting to have the title of crew chief.

So much is expected of a crew chief that a normal day on the job is in the neighborhood of twelve hours and that a seventy hour work week becomes routine. It takes this much time and oftentimes more to oversee all that an owner puts his crew chief in charge of.

He must be able to oversee a work force that sometimes will number around 50, but while doing so be able to oversee even the smallest detail associated with the construction of a race car. He is expected to know and understand every aspect of building and setting up a Winston Cup car.

Even with all that is expected

from him, a crew chief soon finds out that his position is just have the least amount of job security than any other job associated with the sport. Already this year there has been 15 crew chiefs lose their jobs. Several teams have changed crew chiefs more than once this season, while there has only been two major driver changes on the year.

When things begin to go bad for a team it is the crew chief that begins to catch all of the heat for the team's misfortunes. If a car doesn't handle right, if the engine is down on horsepower, or if any part breaks on the car it is the crew chief who must assume full responsibility.

It seems that the only misfortunes of a team that isn't the direct responsibility of the crew chief are the mistakes made on the track by the driver. An owner is slower to let go of a driver than he is a crew chief, because many times the driver is tied into a sponsor's marketing plans.

At the present time owner, Robert Yates is in negotiations with Texaco for renewal of their sponsorship deal and one of the hang-ups of the deal is Texaco's insistence that Kenny Irwin remain the driver of Yates' car. With sponsors who are willing to put up the big money that

is necessary to race competitively on the circuit and far between, often times they have the final say on just who will sit in the driver's seat.

In recent years, the sport has seen the salaries of crew chiefs rise to the point that the average salary now falls somewhere around a quarter million dollars. Some of the more proven crew chiefs may even see their salary approach the half million mark.

With that much money comes responsibility, Winston Cup is a sport that more and more you are being judged on your last couple of races and not what is on your resume. A case in point is the recent firing of Paul Andrews from Jeremy Mayfield's Mobile One team.

1998 saw Mayfield and Andrews become the talk of the circuit as the two combined to win the first race of Mayfield's career and become a solid top ten performer each weekend. He even led the points chase for much of the first third of the season, before setting for a top ten finish in the points.

Andrews had taken a driver and a team that hadn't experienced much success and turned them into a team that had a chance to win each and every week. Andrews has been a crew chief for 11 years and had a

Winston Cup Championship on his record. In 1992 he teamed up with the late Alan Kulwicki to win the title by the narrowest of margins at the last race of the year in Atlanta.

Even with all of this past success, team owner Michael Kranefuss let Andrews go citing communications problems as just one reason for his team's slow start this season. Whatever the underlying reasons, last year going into the Coca-Cola 600 Mayfield was on top of the points and this season he was in 13th place. That, probably more than anything, contributed to Andrews' release.

Crew chief is just one piece of the puzzle that an owner must put together to have any kind of success in Winston Cup. At one time the driver was the piece of the puzzle that seemed to make everything fit, but now I am not so sure that the first piece of a puzzle that an owner needs to go looking for is that of the crew chief.



Fish and wildlife commission nomination June 22

A meeting to select nominees to represent the Seventh Wildlife District on the Fish and Wildlife Resources Commission will be held at 7:30 p.m. EDT Tuesday, June 22, at Knott County Central High School in Hindman. The school is located at 95 Perkins-Madden Road, Highway 160 East, one mile southeast of Hindman.

Residents of the Seventh Wildlife District who have purchased a hunting or fishing license, or registered a boat in the state of Kentucky, in each of the past two consecutive years (or who have hunted or fished in Kentucky during the past two years, but were not required to buy licenses), may participate in the meeting.

The Seventh District is made

up of the following counties: Breathitt, Floyd, Johnson, Knott, Lawrence, Leslie, Letcher, Magoffin, Martin, Perry and Pike.

Five nominees will be selected at the meeting and their names submitted to the governor, who will appoint one of the five to a four-year term on the commission.

The Fish and Wildlife Resources Commission is a nine-member board which oversees the operations of the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources. The commission approves the department's budget, sets season dates and approves all regulations pertaining to hunting, fishing and wildlife conservation.

The current commission member from the seventh district is Doug Hensley, Hazard.







UofL HOOPS RECRUITING

If they clear eligibility requirements, 6-9, 230-pound Ben Eze Ndubuisi and 6-11, 220 Muhamed Lasege completes a major recruiting coup for UofL that could push Cardinal basketball into a preseason Top 10 ranking.

Before making his choice Duhon is investigating why Duke and UK had players leave their programs this year and says he will likely wait until spring to pick a school. He also told media during a basketball camp in Chapel Hill, NC last month: "Bi lemson, Maryland, North Carolina, N.C. State, UConn, Georgetown, and Miami.

√ Brian Boddicker, an improving 6-9, 225 pound power forward from Duncanville, will probably sign with Texas, but also lists Texas A&M, TCU, SMU, Rice, Kentucky, UCLA, Stanford, Ohio State, Duke, Arizona, Kansas, Iowa, Purdue and Baylor.

√ Chris Alexander, a 7-1, 236-pound center prospect from Harvey, Ill. may be headed to DePaul or Wisconsin, but is interested in Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Duke, UConn, Georgetown, St. John's, DePaul, Auburn, Kentucky and Fresno State.




POISON OAK

Rub them with a chicken's foot

The fancy, scientific name for them is Verruca Vulgaris.

We just call them warts.

Even though the dictionary defines them in a rather distasteful way, as "horny projections on the skin, usually of the extremities," when I was a boy growing up in Muddy Branch in the 1940s, we wore them proudly.

We associated warts with manliness because everybody knew you got them from handling toad frogs. (Not to be confused with bull frogs.) Of course, a sissy wouldn't handle either one.

"Look at my hand, son. That's a beauty, ain't it."

"Wow! Look at the size of that seed wart. My brother used to have one just like that, but Mommy had Booten take it off."

Booten was an old gentleman named Booten Puckett, and he could charm your warts and they'd go away. We had no idea whence he got his magical powers, nor did we care.

However, for some reason warts aren't as desirable now as they once were. I've been a collector of sorts of old-time cures and superstitions for more than a dozen years, and folks send me more cures for warts than just about any other affliction.

Interestingly, many of these cures are variations of one theme or another. For example, I've received several involving the "dishrag" theory.

A Madison Heights, Michigan, man wrote that your warts will go away if you steal a dishrag, rub it on the warts, then hide it.

According to another reader, you can get rid of warts by rubbing them with a dishrag and then putting it under the drip of the house. By the time the rag rots, your warts will be gone.

Regarding the "drip-of-the-house" idea, one lady suggested that a good way to rid yourself of warts was to rub them with pebbles from the drip of the house. Then, place the pebbles in a cloth and drop them in the forks of the road.

Another theme for wart removal involves the "knot" theory.

A lady from Circleville, Ohio, says that your warts will go away if you tie as many knots as you have warts into a piece of yarn, then hide it.

A Staffordsville man got a little more detailed: "Tie as many knots as you have warts into a string. Hide the string under a rock. When the string rots, the warts will be gone."

Other wart cures that have been recommended include sleeping with a piece of salt pork on the wart; rubbing the wart with soda water a couple of times a day for a week or two; putting castor oil on them; and rubbing them with slices of raw potato.

I suppose the most unusual cure, though, was sent in by a Hager Hill woman who says you can get rid of a wart by rubbing it with a chicken's foot.

She didn't mention whether or not the chicken should still be attached.

• McDowell Elementary Cafeteria, 90: Milk observed stored on the floor of walk-in cooler. First cooler has leak resulting in frost buildup in interior. Microwave interior in disrepair. Handle on food warmer in disrepair. Meat slicer slightly soiled. Shelving behind equipment slightly soiled. Floors in disrepair and baseboards in disrepair. Walls and ceiling in disrepair.

• Betsy Layne High School Cafeteria, 87: Critical violation found. Floor drain accessing the three-compartment sink is overflowing wastewater out onto the food preparation floor area. Drain appears to be plugged, not allowing water from three-compartment sink and other sources to drain. School officials given one day to correct.

Also, dishwashing machine is not dispensing sanitizing solution during final rinse. No sanitizing of utensils is taking place. Facility is directed to utilize disposal utensils until such time that the dishwashing machine is repaired. Other violations: Thermometer in upright freezer in dishwashing area is not functioning properly. Inside the ice machine is slight buildup of mineral and other deposits. THINGS TO PONDER

Looking at the child behind school violence

Well, school is finally out and everyone will have their own individual memories of this academic year. However, the impact of violence within schools nationally and/or threatened violence regionally will not be forgotten. Also, various groups are having their reactions, such as lawmakers tightening the loopholes so minors cannot buy guns. Of course, since my perspective is often from a mental health viewpoint as a child advocate, an opinion is that families, school staff, peers, friends, neighbors, and community members can help decrease the likelihood of local adolescents acting-out via school shootings. Hopefully, as we learn more about the teenagers who become obsessed with harming others, the better a prevention/treatment plan will be.

A recent article in a professional journal, *The Forensic Examiner* (McGee & DeBernardo, 1999), described the typical adolescent—Classroom Avenger—based on those involved in 12 non-traditional shooting incidents in U.S. middle and high schools from 1993-1998. The major similarities across events were: (1) the cause tended to be discipline by parents or authorities and/or rejection by peers or girlfriends; (2) the motive was vengeance; and (3) the action was a premeditated shooting spree

with parents, fellow students and/or faculty/school administrators as target victims.

Several demographic and dispositional factors were identified as consistent of the usual adolescent involved. The student was a physically healthy, Caucasian male with the average age of 15 from a range of 11 to 17 years old. Financially, his family was in the blue collar to middle-class range. Usually, he lived in a rural area or a city of less than 50,000 people; 7 of 12 attacks occurred within a 350 mile radius in five southern states. Common family characteristics included: divorced and/or separated parents, often quite dysfunctional with frequent episodes of intense anger, hostility, arguing, and friction between parents and parent-child power struggles and battles over control. Parents are at risk for becoming the Classroom Avenger's first victims. Supposedly parental discipline was overly harsh and inconsistent. It was not unusual for close family members to be mentally ill, personality disordered, or a substance abuser. The student's family invariably owned guns; in all but one shooting spree the gun came from home.

Although the Classroom Avenger's physical appearance was generally unremarkable, some preferred military outfits without the "in-style" tattoos, body piercing, and exotic hair styles. The individuals had a negative body image and viewed themselves as physically unattractive. Classmates shared this opinion

and frequently labeled them as "geeks" or "nerds."

Other general characteristics were identified from the Classroom Avenger's childhood history. He did not have handicaps or disabilities, but his beginning to walk, talk, and toilet training was somewhat delayed. Bonding or social attachments problems were shown; i.e., perceived as unaffectionate, standoffish, aloof, and overly fearful of strangers. Possible indicators of antisocial tendencies were identified—excessive lying and deceit, bed wetting, fire setting, and animal abuse. Sibling rivalry was beyond the expected range and temper tantrums were particularly fierce. Even though he did not stand out as abnormal, subtle signs of being somehow odd or negatively different from peers were sometimes noticed by teachers. Grades were usually in the average or above-average range, but often declined in the weeks or months preceding his violent outbursts. The student was not likely to have extensive histories of delinquency and police involvement. Instead, he tended to be involved in vandalism, cunning dishonesty, and excessive secretiveness. The Classroom Avenger was friendless, immature, and socially inadequate loners, who preferred being with younger children and continued to play soldiers. His "friends" were also outsiders, who likely had been rejected by peers, shared a common interest in some rigid, highly eccentric world view, and were bored by normal teenage activi-

ties. Classmates, who excelled and were popular, were envied, resented, and often became primary targets. In contrast to other adolescents, who were interested in cars, music, and proms, he was obsessed with making bombs, focused upon media portrayals of real or fictional violence, and was intensely interested in violence-centered websites.

Common emotional traits were also identified in this preliminary review of the Classroom Avenger. His mood was significantly depressed. However, he did not verbalize sadness and lack of energy, but showed depressed feelings other ways: sullen, angry, irritable, temper outbursts, seclusiveness, destruction of property, vandalism, stubbornness, oppositionality, derogation of others, excessive risk taking, and verbalizing "My life sucks." These behaviors usually increased in frequency and intensity prior to the shooting episodes. The Classroom Avenger blamed others for his problems, anticipated rejections, was suspicious and distrustful of others' motives, and viewed himself as a victim. He lacked insight, was easily frustrated, and did not have adequate coping skills. Higher functioning and socially appropriate peers perceived him as weird, awkward, etc., so that he was teased and ridiculed, which led to retaliation.

Eventually, the Classroom Avenger's motive was vengeance. Extremely far in advance of the attack, he began fantasizing and mentally rehearsing his acts of violence; predatory aggression

that was selective, calculating, and premeditated. A hypothesis was that the student wished to die, wished to kill, and wished to be killed.

By no means is this all there is to the clear understanding of our episodes of real and threatened violence. The possible impact of a "copycat" response or the influence of music, TV, or films has not been clarified. As with so many of society's problems, a so-called "common sense" impression

would be that parents, families, schools, and community members need to do and provide for children what is known to be of benefit to children from day one. This also would mean allowing children to be responsible for their feelings and behaviors. If children are not behaving as expected for their age range and parents have done what they know to do, seek professional assistance. Ask questions. Don't just let things go that involve your child.

Extension News

Can reduce cancer risks

Despite a decline in the U.S. cancer rate in recent years, Kentucky has higher levels of certain types of cancer. However, Kentuckians can make some lifestyle changes to help reduce the risk of cancer. This disease is the Commonwealth's second leading cause of death after coronary heart disease.

"The number of new cancer cases and deaths is declining nationwide, largely because many people have changed health-related behaviors," said Janet Tietyen, assistant professor of food and nutrition for the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture. "However, Kentucky has a slightly higher level in all cases of cancer. The rates are higher for all cancers in women as well as lung and colorectal cancer in men and women as well as lung and colorectal cancer in men and women, according to data from the Kentucky Cancer Registry's 1996 Kentucky Cancer Incidence.

"We need to take better care of ourselves to reduce the chances of developing cancer. Daily practices that increase our risk of cancer include eating and smoking habits and lack of physical activity. Knowing the importance of medical screening techniques and using these and other health care practices can decrease our risk of developing this disease."

"Most people don't just wake up one morning and have cancer," she added. "Lifetime behavior has a cumulative effect on the risk of developing some types of cancer such as breast, colon and lung, especially in later years. While some people have a genetic predisposition that increases the risk for certain type of cancer, many can reduce the risk of cancer by changing their diet, exercise and smoking habits."

Nationwide, about 35 percent of the cancer deaths are related to poor eating habits, according to the American Dietetic Association.

From a dietary standpoint, Tietyen said, people can help lower cancer risk factors by eating foods that are low in saturated fats and

high in dietary fiber and nutrients, notably calcium and folic acid.

Fruits, vegetables and whole-grain products are good sources of fiber and many nutrients essential for good health. Foods that are plentiful in fiber and nutrients include broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, kale and other greens, as well as fruits, especially those eaten with the peeling like apples, pears and the like.

Some research studies have indicated that consuming sufficient calcium and folic acid, a B complex vitamin, might help reduce the risk of colon cancer. To supply the calcium, but not excess fat, Tietyen recommended eating at least two to three servings daily of low-fat or no-fat dairy products such as milk, yogurt and cheese. Ready-to-eat or fortified cereals, leafy green vegetables, beans and nuts are good sources of folic acid.

Nutrient-rich diets also tend to be low in calories, which helps people lose excess pounds and maintain a healthful weight.

"Many studies offer proof positive that increasing physical activity can decrease the risk of certain

cancers, including colon cancer which is the third most common cancer in the U.S.," Tietyen said. "Other studies have shown decreased risks of lung and prostate cancer among people who exercise moderately. Even small amounts of exercise such as gardening, cleaning house and walking briskly, on a regular basis are helpful. The American Cancer Society recommends at least 30 minutes of physical activity on most days, preferably five times a week.

"It's also important to achieve and maintain a healthy weight. Obesity is a risk factor for many types of cancer as well as other major health problems such as diabetes and coronary heart disease."

Early detection is critical to increase the cure rate for many types of cancer, including colon and breast, according to Tietyen.

"Many screening procedures are available today to help reduce the severity of cancer as well as the death rate," she said. "For instance, the cure rate for colon cancer can reach 90 percent when the disease is detected early. So check with your physician about the various screening techniques if you have a genetic predisposition that increases your risk of cancer or if your diet, exercise or smoking habits increase your chance of developing this disease."

Several Extension publications have additional information on eating for health. They include "The Diet and Cancer Connection," "Phytochemicals for Cancer Prevention," "Quick and Easy Meals to Lower Cancer Risk" and "Women and Cancer." These publications are available by contacting the county Extension office (606-886-2668).


Reverend Hargis also gave the invocation after which other appropriate song selections were rendered by Libbi and Patricia.
