

Drug sweep suspects plead guilty

PRESTONSBURG - Two Floyd County residents rounded up by authorities during a drug sweep in August pleaded guilty in circuit court Friday to trafficking charges, as another individual arrested during the same drug raid was sentenced for similar charges.

Guilty pleas entered by Beaver residents Dwayne Hall, 31, and Stevie Hall, 29, were the results of plea agreements with the Commonwealth's Attorney's office on November 15. Floyd County resident Ronnie Hall, 38, pleaded guilty to similar charges last month after a similar agreement was reached with the Commonwealth's Attorney's office.

Their arrests, part of a seven-month investigation by Kentucky State Police and the Floyd County Sheriff's Office, led to their indictments on August 7 by a Floyd County grand jury. Additionally, police officials also arrested 27 other residents of Floyd, Magoffin and Johnson counties on that day.

"We're taking drug cases very seriously," said Commonwealth's Attorney Brent Turner Friday. "Any time we are able, we will seek felony convictions and jail time in these cases.

Of the two who entered guilty pleas in circuit court Friday, Dwayne Hall,

facing two counts of trafficking in controlled substances for selling Lortab and OxyContin on or about March 21, accepted possibly the stiffest agreement with the Commonwealth's office for his participation in the events which led to his arrest during the drug sweep.

In return for his guilty plea, the commonwealth suggested a five-year sentence for each count against Dwayne Hall, to run concurrently with one another and concurrently with two additional first- and third-degree trafficking charges against him.

One sex scam suspect leaves jail, another goes back

PRESTONSBURG - As one Floyd County resident dubbed as a participant in an alleged sex scheme conspiracy earlier this year received formal sentencing in circuit court on Friday, another member of the alleged clan faced a bond revocation hearing.

Floyd County Circuit Judge John David Caudill entered formal sentencing for David resident Michael Woods, 46, on Friday for charges relating to the alleged sex scheme conspiracy, a conspiracy which led to the indictments of his wife, Tammy Woods, 30, who recently pleaded guilty to related charges; Randy Minor of Martin; Theresa Jones, 42, of Prestonsburg; and Patricia Shepherd, 30, Prestonsburg.

Police chase ends Adkins' shock probation

PRESTONSBURG - A Floyd County man who received shock probation for DUI offenses earlier this year was sentenced Friday for probation violations relating to similar DUI charges

Circuit Judge John David Caudill ordered David Allen Adkins, 37, of Grethel, to carry out a sentence that was probated in March following plea bargain agreements with the Commonwealth Attorney's office.

In lieu of a plea agreement with the commonwealth, Adkins pleaded guilty in Circuit Court on March 22 to operating a with 12 additional DUF motor vehicle while under related charges, and a potenthe influence, a Class A misdemeanor, and operating a motor vehicle with a revoked or DUI-suspended license, a Class D felony. In return for his guilty

plea, the commonwealth

suggested a sentence of 12 months on the misdemeanor charge and a one year sentence on the felony charge. The plea bargain also stipulated the dismissal of four other charges against Adkins - reckless driving. improper registration plates, no valid registration receipts and no insurance.

In the plea bargain agreement filed with the circuit court office on March 14, the Commonwealth also agreed to "take no position on shock probation after the defendant has served the statutory minimum on the DUI charge," a promise they upheld just a few months prior to another incident which landed Adkins tially dangerous situation for his 11-year-old son.

According to reports, these individuals used the promise of sexual favors to burglarize thousands of dollars from residents throughout Floyd County, Allegedly, one of the perpetrators would divert the victims' attention while the others burglarized residences.

Micheal Woods, represented Friday by attorney Ira Branham, pleaded guilty on November 21 to one count of receiving stolen property, a Class D felony, and possession of drug paraphernalia, a misdemeanor, charges he faced after participating in thefts which occurred at the home of Jeffrey Caudill on May 6.

Reports indicate that Tammy Woods, Minor and Shepherd

Louisville dealer ruffles feathers with East Ky. sales

PRESTONSBURG - Even as potential buyers circled the rows of vehicles lining Wal-Mart parking lot Friday afternoon, the Prestonsburg Ordinance Committee was busy discussing whether Louisville's Star Ford dealership's newly introduced, overstocked inventory display could mean problems for city dealerships and local residents.

dealership with two locations in arrived Louisville, in Prestonsburg Wednesday and by Thursday was set up at the Wal-Mart parking lot in the Prestonsburg Village Shopping Center and ready to move what Star Ford's sales manager Scott Terry called a huge amount of overstocked vehicles.

According to Terry, the group of 20 salespeople and associates plan to remain in Prestonsburg

Star Ford, an automobile until today for what would be a four-day elimination sale.

These short term plans were the primary example cited during the committee's special-called meeting Friday as Mayor Jerry Fannin urged committee members to come together and discuss recommendations for an extension of a preliminary ordinance draft to be fine-tuned and adopted for presentation to the

PRESTONSBURG - Floyd County Sheriff John K. Blackburn and Fayette County Sheriff Kathy H. Whitt are issuing a call to their counterparts statewide to join in an effort to help an organization which helps sick children.

Blackburn and Whitt are taking part in a cooperative program that will provide transportation to Shriners Hospitals and other facilities to help children receive free medical care in place of financial difficulty.

Blackburn said Whitt, who as a woman cannot be a standing Shriner member, does however have a tremendous amount of energy in

supporting the initiative to bring medical treatment to children.

"She can't be a member, but she works hard anyway," said Blackburn. "She's a good example for those who think they can't help otherwise. If I weren't a sheriff, I would still help in this cause."

The cause will be a cooperative effort taken on by county sheriffs to provide free transportation for children with orthopedic problems or burn injuries to various hospitals and facilities for treatment. The program was initiated in July by Larry Terango, chairman of the Oleika Temple, and was ultimately implemented by Blackburn on October 10.

Although the cooperative efforts only recently became official, Blackburn, who has been a member of the Oleika Temple since 1990, has made efforts as a Shriner since that time

According to Kelly Moore, former head of the Oleika Temple, the Shriners have taken approximately 100 trips each year since 1990. many times taking three children at a time to the Shriners Hospital in Lexington and the Burn Center in Cincinnati.

"What we do is we have a van we use to transport the children," said Blackburn. "We'll come to their house and pick them up, and the trip is a round trip, there and back. If it's just one kid, then we'll still go and get them and take them to the hospital.'

"We've got some big deals going up at Wal-Mart." said Cooley at the onset of the meeting. "The thing is this - what if you go up there and buy a vehicle off one of those guys and it breaks down later? You don't know who it was you bought from, so where do you go?

in June, a condition of the courts that grants probation to inmates who are "shocked" by brief incarceration, hoping they will so affected by the experience that the criminal activity will not be repeated.

However, that wasn't the case with Adkins.

Ridgway's argument to persuade the court to grant shock probation included the fact that Adkins "suffered hardship due to his incarceration," had a job working with a former Floyd County clerk, and because his children, who were placed with relatives during his incarceration, needed him to "care and support them."

With no argument from the commonwealth, shock probation was granted by Circuit Judge John David Caudill on June 12, ordering a two-year probation for Adkins. Adkins was ordered to pay more than \$250 in court costs and fines, to adhere to conditions stipulated by the Probation and Parole office, and to undergo drug and alcohol education for one year. Additionally, Caudill ordered Adkins' license to be revoked for the period of his pro-

porary business venture, sparked more potential problems that could arise, according to committee members.

Collins, examining the ordinance which presently exists for temporary business establishments, pointed out that if the company were to set up for an extended period, such as a month, they could actually manage a lower fee to be payable to the city.

The ordinance states that a fee of \$300 a day would be required for businesses or events that last less than a week," said Collins. "But there is only a charge of \$25 per month."

The committee, realizing they were faced with a need to amend the present ordinance, agreed to have Fannin instate a new title for the committee to include licenses as well as ordinances and to do so

The newly drafted ordinance, which will now be sent onto the full council for final approval, states that the city wishes to "promote the existence of long-term and legitimate business interests" which may be conducted within the city limits, adding that the distribution and sale of vehicles within the city has an affect on the general economy, public interest and public welfare of the city of Prestonsburg. Based on these statements, the ordinance further claims the need to regulate dealers of vehicles to "prevent frauds, impositions and other abuses upon its citizens."

If the ordinance is passed by council, automobile dealerships

fer of a motor vehicle, no registration plates, no registration receipt, no insurance and reckless driving.

Although several of those charges, including the two counts of wanton endangerment and one count of reckless driving, were dismissed following a pretrial conference for Adkins in October, other charges against him regarding the incident were sent to a grand jury for consideration. District Judge Eric Hall referred charges including driving on a DUI-suspended license, no insurance, and operating a motor vehicle under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol to the grand

Following the sentencing on Friday, Adkins was transported to the Floyd County Jail, where he will serve the remainder of the 12-month sentence for the previous DUI-related charges. According to Caudill, all jail time already served by Adkins will be credited to time to be served with the sentencing Friday. The charges against Adkins concerning the Mud Creek chase will be considered by the grand jury at a later date.

cases. Shepherd pleaded guilty to all but two of the latter charges during her arraignment on Dec. 13 in district court, a fact that left her attorney, Harolyn Howard, speechless when proposing arguments in circuit court on her behalf Friday.

will be made to conduct business from a "bona fide" location, in that the establishment will be expected to include both an office, which is not to be used for any other purpose, and a vehicle storage or display lot and must have its own mailing address. Also, a prospective business will be expected to have a sign identifying the dealership by name, placed on the lot and easily seen from the nearest roadway, with lettering of at least 9 inches in height. Dealers will be made to have a valid license and be required to also pay the license fees required by the city.

The committee, although not satisfied, could not deny the fact that Star Ford representatives had, as of Friday, remained in compliance with the ordinance already in place, and Terry was quick to point this fact out himself.

"We're not here to piss anybody off," said Terry. "We're doing what the city says to do, but we knew this was going to happen. It happens everywhere we go.'

Terry explained that most cities and towns the company has visited have expressed the same concerns and agreed that those concerns would perhaps, in business terms, be his own as well. However, he maintained that the city's claim that he and his associates were taking revenue from the city is simply not accurate.

'We've not taken any business that hasn't been turned away by the dealerships already in the city," continued Terry. "And if this thing

the Commonwealth's suggestions on Friday, as bailiffs transported Dwayne Hall from the courtroom into an adjoining holding cell to await his sentencing hearing. Dwayne Hall could have faced up to 25 years in prison for these charges, had he not accepted deal.

In addition to Dwayne Hall's guilty plea, Grethel resident Stevie Hall, charged with second-degree trafficking in a controlled substance and two counts of complicity to traffic in controlled substances for selling and contributing in the selling of Lortab and OxyContin, also entered a guilty plea in circuit court Friday.

Plea agreements entered with the commonwealth for Stevie Hall stipulated a suggested three-year sentence to be probated for two years after service of one year for the second-degree trafficking charge. The commonwealth's suggestion on this charge is to run concurrently with the suggested sentence offered for the complicity in trafficking charges. For the seconddegree complicity to trafficking charge, the commonwealth also suggested a three-year sentence, likewise to be suspended and probated for two years after service of one year. In return for his guilty plea, the commonwealth additionally offered the dismissal of the first-degree complicity to traffic

According to Terry, he and the other 19 Star Ford representatives have each paid for hotel rooms and food during their stay and this is a very real boost to the city's econo-

Another reason Terry said Prestonsburg became a good location to visit was the lack of Ford dealerships in the area, adding that Star Ford has plans to return again to Prestonsburg in the future.

"We target places that have no Ford dealerships, and most of the time we hardly even break even as far as profit goes," said Terry. "What I'm trying to do is get rid of inventory that is overstocked. If I don't then I'll be having to pay."

Terry said that feedback from the community has been that they have been able to get deals since early Thursday that would not have been there otherwise.

Bee Handshoe, a Prestonsburg man who purchased a truck from Star Ford on Friday, said it was about the better deal.

"I got a good deal on my truck," said Handshoe. "I got a \$4,000 better deal, and I was going to go to Hazard to buy if I hadn't found this today."

With 100 vehicles beginning Thursday morning, Terry said that approximately 90 were still on display Friday, meaning the company has sold roughly 10 vehicles in about one day.

As expected, some local automobile dealerships, such as Brad Hughes Toyota, are strictly against the temporary approach of Star Ford's selling techniques.

"It's a situation where these dealers come into an area, don't pay payroll taxes and don't give anything back to the community," said dealership owner Brad Hughes. "They take money from unsuspecting, poor folks most of the time and then leave town ... These dealers are coming out of metro markets; it's not like they really need the money."

Hughes, who feels these type of dealerships are targeting Eastern Kentucky, said the presence of the dealership in the Prestonsburg Village Shopping Center was most likely brought to the attention of the committee by one or more automobile dealerships in the area, but explained he wasn't sure which ones "spearheaded the endeavor," adding that he feels an ordinance to regulate such selling in the future would be beneficial to the community.

"I think it would protect the community," said Hughes, who added Star Ford's inventory sale has deflated the livelihood of his 28 employees. "They're not the first people to come in and do this kind of thing - this happened in Pikeville and Hazard and other places before. I hope that we can put a stop to these type of sales for the benefit of local residents and dealership employees all along the Big Sandy region."

In return of his guilty plea, the commonwealth's attorney's office suggested a two-year sentence for the felony charge against Michael Woods to run concurrently with a 12-month sentence for the misdemeanor charge, a suggestion that was accepted by Circuit Judge John David Caudill on Friday. Woods' sentence is suspended for time served - 191 days as of Friday - and he is to remain under supervised probation for two years. He was also ordered to pay restitution in the amount of \$1,200 to Jeffrey Caudill. Restitution payments begin in January and will continue for six months. Additionally, Woods is placed under a 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.

The bond revocation hearing held for Patricia Shepherd came about after the commonwealth's attorney's office filed a motion this month to revoke her bond.

While out on bond for two counts of theft by unlawful taking over \$300 and a promoting prostitution charge. Shepherd was arrested by Kentucky State Police Trooper Byron Hansford. That arrest left her to answer to additional charges, including reckless driving, operating a motor vehicle under the influence of drugs or alcohol, no insurance, failure to wear a seat belt, no registration receipt, driving on a DUI-suspended license, and giving a false name or address.

Because her arrest was a violation of her probation, the commonwealth filed a motion to curfew during his probation and revoke her bond on the previous are still pending.

After pleading guilty to those charges on December 13, District Judge James R. Allen sentenced her to six months for the DUI charge, seven days on the giving a false name or address charge, and a six-month probated sentence of 90 days for driving on a DUI-suspended license. Additionally, Allen ordered her to pay more than \$1,000 in fines and court costs.

During Friday's proceedings, Judge John David Caudill ordered a \$5,000 cash bond against Shepherd on a theft by unlawful taking charge to run concurrently with an additional \$5,000 cash bond on another theft by unlawful taking charge and the promoting prostitution charge.

Eastern Kentucky

This January, dress your kids for the beach, head to Ashland and dig for seashells.

If it's real fish you're after, be sure to check out the large tropical fish habitat, As a souvenir, they can drive home with an origami whale. But what they won't get is a sunburn. Not bad for a day at the beach.

Life-size shark models, adventure guides and videos of little-seen footage of sharks in the wild complete this wild adventure. More than 500,000 people have visited the exhibit since it opened last May.

Guestview Treat, try Walker like a traitor

John Walker looks for all the world like a traitor. He should be treated like one. Walker is the 20-year-old former Californian dragged out of the Afghanistan prison camp along with the Taliban fighters he apparently joined after deciding America was no place for a bright, young man to seek his fortune.

Walker converted to Islam four years ago and fought shoulder-to-shoulder with the Taliban. Whether he did battle against the American war effort — a key factor in deciding if Walker can be convicted of treason — is still undetermined.

But what is know is that Walker supported the wretched regime that had as its objective the destruction of the United States. He may have been part of Osama bin Laden's Al-Qaeda organization and reportedly supported wholeheartedly the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks on his native land, although it is not known whether he played a role in the planning or execution.

Nor is it known whether Walker participated in the fatal beating of a CIA agent during the uprising at the Mazar-i-Sharif prison camp. But the fact that Walker was in Afghanistan, fighting to support one of the most evil governments in the history of mankind, makes him a real bad guy, not the impressionable, wayward youth described by his attorney, James Brosnahan. If you buy that argument, how can you not also apply it to the young suicide terrorists who carried out the Sept. 11 attacks after being brainwashed by bin Laden?

The United States is at war, and its citizens should understand there are severe consequences for supporting the enemy. At some point, Walker had to know the bombs falling on him and his fellow villains were coming from American planes. At that point, he should have quit the fight.

The Bush administration has made the case for suspending due process and trying war criminals — as he labeled the Taliban and al-Qaeda — in military tribunals.

If that's good enough for foreign-born enemies, it's good enough for Walker. If the law won't permit that, given his tenuous claim on U.S. citizenship, Walker should be promptly tried for treason — or hauled into civilian court to be tried on whatever other charge can be made to stick. President George W. Bush has described Walker as a "poor fellow" who has obvi-

Beginning a new century and a new millennium with a world war would have been unthinkable to most individuals last year at this time. But the attacks on the World Trade Towers and the Pentagon and the resulting loss in thousands of lives have changed us forever. We have lost our innocence. We understand now that we are vulnerable to acts of terrorism. For the remainder of most of our lives we will mark time and history by this date.

While we are experiencing one of America's gravest hours, the strength of our great country has always been its ability to overcome both adversity and evil. History has demonstrated over and over again that it is often during very difficult times that we see the greatest examples of leadership emerge. We have seen such leadership during the past three months, as we have become a united nation in support of our President and military in their response to this aggression. As Americans we must continue to move forward and prove to the world that our spirit and resolve will not be broken by a group of crazed terrorists. This holds particularly true for Kentucky. Over a decade ago citizens in Kentucky took up the mantel of leadership when they committed themselves to reforming the educational product in the state. The 1990 Kentucky Education

Reform Act and the 1997 Postsecondary Education Improvement Act happened because citizens, legislators, business leaders, community leaders, educators and students partnered together to make them a reality. A commitment was made to stop the 100 years of decline that had resulted in Kentucky being ranked at the bottom of states in many indicators including education, per-capita income, and other quality-of-life issues. Walker should not be allowed to hide behind the citizenship he so obviously despised when he made his bed with enemies of America.

Why Indonesia hates us

The peoples of Indonesia have a long history of occupation and control by foreign interests — the Dutch, British and then the Japanese.

After World War II, Indonesia finally became free and independent. They had an elected democracy with a president who had a vision and idea of ethnic and religious tolerance. He also had a vision of the natural resources being owned and controlled by the peoples of Indonesia for their own benefit. That was the dangerous idea that led to a plot halfway around the globe to oust his government.

The president was Sukarno (not to be confused with the brutal dictator Suharto who was to take n., place). The plotters were the Freeport Sulfur Company and Henry Kissinger.

In 1965, 500,000 to 1 million Indonesian were slaughtered. Time magazine ran a story describing small rivers and streams clogged with bodies. The coup leader was Suharto, with CIA and U.S. military backing.

After the coup, Suharto claimed oil wells, sugar plantations and forest lands for himself and his family. Some 19 oil companies flocked in to claim ownership of oil fields. Weyerhuaser, International Paper, Boise Cascade grabbed huge tracks of forest in Sumatra and began cutting them down.

Kissinger's payoff was the Freeport Gold Mine Corp. (for which today he is paid \$500,000 a year as chief legal rep. and was the first company licensed by the Suharto dictatorship after the coup).

In 1975 Kissinger's gold mine interest and Suharto's oil well interest were threatened by an independence movement in East Timor. Kissinger and Gerald Ford planned an invasion launched Dec. 6, 1975. The attack began just after Air Force One cleared Indonesia air space carrying Kissinger.

Indonesia is a country where 60 percent of the people live below the poverty line, where many were kicked off their land and the wealth, the natural resources are owned by foreign corporations and the political elite put in power after the the 1965 coup.

All the tax burden is put on the poor and the business owners and wealthy are tax exempt. Under these conditions their is much civil unrest.

Health departments offer a solution for smokers

FRANKFORT - A common item on the New Year's resolution list is to stop smoking.

The Kentucky Tobacco Use Prevention and Cessation Program in the Cabinet for Health Services is offering help to smokers who want to quit during 2002.

Local health departments throughout Kentucky are engaging in a number of activities to reduce the risks of tobacco use, including classes to help smoking. The people quit Cooper/Clayton Method to Stop showed that Kentucky led the nation in Johnson County, where the health

Smoking classes last 13 weeks and are available in all areas. Most are free, however some may charge a nominal fee to cover the cost of the materials.

"I am pleased to see that so many different people are taking advantage of programs offered by their local health departments," said Dr. Rice Leach, commissioner of the Department for Public Health. "It is truly gratifying to hear from Kentuckians that our activities are helping them help themselves."

A recent report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

the percentage of adults who smoke ---30.5 percent. The Tobacco Use Prevention and Cessation Program was funded with \$5.5 million in tobacco settlement money to help people stop smoking.

Programs have been established in all 55 local health departments. There are other cessation services available, including teen cessation programs offered through schools.

Bill Barker, a retired radio announcer who smoked for 54 years, recently completed the Cooper-Clayton course department offers the class. He has not and former smoker. smoked since.

"The class pointed out to me the dangers of smoking and that I would have to believe I could quit," Barker said. "It wasn't easy but I was determined.'

Gerald Preston, the tobacco coordinator and class teacher in Johnson County, said 11 of the 21 people who have attended his classes have managed to stop smoking. His last class of six students represented more than 170 years of smoking. Preston is assisted by Ken Williams, a respiratory therapist

"I'd like to see this program make a difference." Preston said,

Denise Wooley, the tobacco coordinator for the Purchase District Health Department in Western Kentucky, said working as a group helps many smokers who have previously tried to quit.

"Knowing other people who are trying to quit has really helped - they like meeting with each other," said Wooley, whose program serves residents in Ballard, Calloway, Carlisle,

Potatoes offer endless possibilities

Nothing satisfies or pleases me more than or as much as potatoes — except maybe pasta. Cooked any way at all, I love them. And I love almost any variety, though I'm not crazy about the looks of the purple or blue ones. I can't say I have a favorite variety, although I mostly buy Idahos and cook them any way I like with good result. And there's so much you can do with them.

In the first recipe that follows, and which is pictured, Idaho potatoes and pleasingly sweet parsnips are cooked together, drained, mashed, heaped into baked acorn squash "bowls" and baked for about 30 minutes.

That's followed by Potatoes Au Gratin, layered sliced uncooked potatoes sprinkled with sharp cheddar cheese and bread crumbs, then baked 45 minutes or so.

POTATOES AND PARSNIPS IN SQUASH BOWLS

 Fill large stockpot halfway with water and heat to boiling. Add potato and parsnip pieces to boiling water; return to boil and cook 6 to 8 minutes or until tender. Drain and place in large bowl.

3. With spoon, scoop out pulp from squash, leaving a 1/2-inch shell so squash keeps its shape. Add acorn pulp to potato mixture. Add milk and mash mixture with fork. (It will be a little lumpy.) Season with salt and pepper.

4. With paring knife, trim bottom of squash halves so they will sit steady, cut side up, making "bowls." Fill each half with about 1/2-cup potato mixture and return to baking pan. Cover with a foil "tent" and bake at 350

F for 30 minutes or until heated through. Makes 8 servings.

DEFER DIG DOMINING

I'm trying to decide if I should have laser eye, surgery for nearsightedness. I am 36 and have worn glasses or contacts for 20 years. I have never been comfortable with either. I'd go for the surgery if I could be sure it would work

and be safe. Is it? - R.L.

ANSWER: Nearsighted eyes are eyes that can see things up close but see distant objects as a blur. The problem comes from the

shape of the eyeball. Nearsighted cyeballs are elongated, and those eyes focus light in front of the retina instead of on it. The retina is the eye's film, which the brain develops into visual pictures.

Glasses bring a clear image to a nearsighted eye by focusing incoming light directly onto the retina.

The most common kind of laser eye surgery is LASIK surgery — laser in situ keratomileusis (CUR-ah-toe-muh-LOOSE-suss).

The cornea is the outer, tough, clear covering of the eye lying directly in front of the pupil. With a laser beam, the eye doctor makes fine incisions in the cornea. Those incisions

TRUE HEROES EARN THE TITLE

Star athletes have played an important part in the lives of young children as far back as history remembers sports and its heroes. Every youngster has had at least one hero that he worshiped above all others. Such idolization is not always etched in stone, however, and heroes have been known to change for many reasons. I was involved in such a change in 1960.

My father was an Air Force master sergeant stationed at a radar station in Bellefontaine, Ohio. The Cincinnati Reds offered discount seating to military personnel in uni-



form, and my father decided to take a group of airmen to a game. The doubleheader between the hometown Reds and the Pittsburgh Pirates was going to be a highlight in my relatively short life.

Although I was an avid New York Yankees fan, one of my favorite baseball players, Roy Face, was a star relief pitcher for the Pirates, and I was hoping to get his autograph. My father bought me a brand-new baseball just in case. I could hardly contain myself on the drive to Cincinnati.

We arrived at the stadium a few minutes before the players were due to take the field, and I lined up with several other youngsters at the entrance to the Pirates locker room. As the players filed out to enter the runway to the dugout, I looked anxiously for Roy Face. I finally saw him coming and, in my best manners, stepped up and asked him for his autograph. He calmly ignored me and proceeded down the runway. I was stunned! One of my favorite heroes had brushed me off without the slightest acknowledgement at all. I stood there pondering what to do

next when a large arm appeared around my shoulders, and a hand took the ball from my grasp. I looked up to see a beaming smile beneath a Pirate hat and a large 21 on the jersey. The man handed me the ball with a wink and headed onto the field. I looked down at the ball and could not believe that it now proudly bore the name ROBERTO CLEMENTE in bold black ink. Roy Face's spot on my hero list had just been filled by one of the greatest players in the game. Clemente played an important part in the Pirates' sweep of the doubleheader that day and helped lead his team to a World Series victory over my Yankees that October. Despite that, he remained one of my greatest heroes until his death in a 1972 airplane crash while flying relief supplies to earthquake victims in Nicaragua. By this time I

had followed my father into the Air Force and was stationed in Southeast Asia. When I learned of Clemente's death, I could only marvel that the man who had helped me find a hero had been a bona fide hero trying to help an entire nation.

Only die-hard fans will remember who Roy Face was, but children who were not yet born when Roberto Clemente died can tell you all about him. That is heroism at its finest,

LASIK surgery is not free of complications. No surgery is. Some people are bothered by the glare from lights, especially at night. A very few have suffered vision loss. If I were younger, I would have the surgery.

I directed this answer at nearsightedness. LASIK, however, can be used for other vision problems - farsightedness and astigmatism.

There are procedures other than LASIK that correct vision. Limitations of space don't permit a discussion of them all.

ZESTY SALMON IN ASPIC

- 3 envelopes unflavored gelatin
- 2 cups boiling chicken broth
- 1 cup Bloody Mary Mix
- 1/2 cup dill sprigs
- 2 hard-cooked eggs, sliced Black olives, pitted, sliced Pimento slices
- 1 cup flaked poached salmon (or equivalent canned, drained)
- 8 ounces Jarlsberg cheese, shredded, divided
- 2 tablespoons Dijon-style mustard
- 1/2 cup each chopped watercress, spinach leaves, parsley

based in Hollywood. Among the many artists scheduled to perform are Blink 182, Bush, the

O'Jays, Pink, Busta Rhymes and Jessica Simpson. Of his own post in Times Square, Clark acknowledges that security will no doubt be much tighter than in years past, "but I don't think it ever even occurred to anyone that we should cancel this show," he adds firmly.

"This is a tradition for many Americans, and it represents something important to them. It's important that we continue with activities like this, and I feel certain we're going to have a lot of fun, as usual."

While Clark may have seniority in his Times Square tenure, CBS' Late Show With David Lettermanalso is on its usual home turf in Manhattan for its holiday evening telecast, while NBC's Tonight Show With Jay Leno airs live from its California studios to the Eastern and Central time zones to cover the traditional dropping of the big ball in Times Square. Fox also plans a 90-minute music special based in Times Square.

Like Clark, veteran newsman Walter Cronkite has become a holiday regular as host of the PBS special From Vienna: The New Year's Celebration 2002. Airing live via satellite (check local listings), this Tuesday, Jan. 1, Great Performancesspecial transports viewers to Vienna's Musikverein concert hall and

"A mutual appreciation of anything brings peoples together -peoples as well as people - in a way that almost nothing else can,"

Cronkite says. "The Vienna concert is helpful in this regard: It's joyful music, primarily featuring pieces by the Strausses - the popular music of its day - and it remains popular around the world.

"Many people in Western Europe plan their New Year's parties around the broadcast. They'll have guests in for wassail or whatever and watch the Vienna concert."

Worldwide, the concert reaches an estimated audience of 750 million, of which the Great PerformancesU.S. audience is only a part. In fact, while Cronkite has been hosting these concerts for two decades, the assignment came as news to friends abroad who watch European coverage of the event.

"I have friends in Western Europe who do not follow American television

News of the Wierd •••

In December, transgender aspirant Jamie Cooper, 16, of Birmingham, England, told reporters that he planned to store some of his sperm before he changes sexes so that, with the use of a surrogate womb, he can eventually be both the father and the mother of a child (which, if it happens, would be a world's first). Cooper is now living openly as a girl, has begun anti-testosterone injections, and, under National Health Service rules, will be eligible for surgery in five years. Various church spokespeople were horrified when told of Cooper's plans.

In December, a Nevada association of private security guards who work at the federal government's supersecret "Area 51" at Groom Lake, 90 miles from Las Vegas, went on strike for higher wages and benefits. In fact, the association president told reporters he could not even divulge the location of his workplace but that the questioner should "use your imagination." When at work, the guards report to the airport in Las Vegas and are flown in nondescript planes to the site, which they are trained to refer to as "nowhere" and "out of town." The guards are called "camo dudes" locally because they wear camouflaged uniforms on patrol.

Recidivist voyeur Daniel W. Searfoss, 43, was charged in November with using a tiny lens in his shoe, attached to a video camera he carried in a bag, to photograph underneath women's skirts at a flea market in Brandon, Fla. He had just finished probation for a similar incident at a Wal-Mart last year, and after detectives scanned 45 videotapes from Searfoss' home, they charged him with another November incident at a Plant City church (perhaps the one in which he performed community service on the Wal-Mart charge). At a December court hearing, the prosecutor told the judge that Searfoss had also tried to point his shoe under the dresses of several women in the county probation office.

"It's Our Policy"

A barber from Scotland was flown at government expense to the Netherlands just to cut the hair of

accused Pan Am Flight 103 bomber (and Scottish prisoner) Abdel Basset al-Megrahi in July because security policy prevents local civilians from doing it. And police in New Bedford, Mass., admitted in November that they had hurt their case by discarding a partial bomb allegedly made by the high school students recently charged with conspiring to blow up their school, because they wrongly thought that policy was to use as evidence only active bombs. And in September, two Pennsylvania state troopers got in trouble for receiving complete, \$60 prostitution services while working undercover, even though policy prevents such sex acts "except in a lifesaving situation or where officers' lives are at stake," according to a state police official.

Compelling Explanations

At his October murder trial in Hackensack, N.J., Agustin Garcia, 49, did not dispute that he shot his former girlfriend to death on her wedding day, but he said the jury ought to sympathize with him, in that he could not help him-

Not My Fault

Howard Strumph filed a lawsuit in September against the Voorhes, Pa., Police Department, claiming that they were responsible for his wife's death in 1999 because they failed to enter the family home quickly enough to save her. As the end of the year approaches, there's still time for taxpayers to make financial moves that could save them hundreds, even thousands of dollars in tax savings. In 2001, there are more creative strategies available to the average taxpayer than in prior years, according to the editors at RIA, a New York-based provider of tax information

Here are a few of them:

Realize losses on stock while substantially preserving investment position. Careful handling of capital gains and losses can save taxes. This is especially relevant for investors during a volatile period such as we've been experiencing.

Taxpayers eligible for the new higher-education expense deduction should defer paying for courses until 2002, or plan to enroll in 2002.

Take distributions from qualified state tuition programs in 2002 to turn fully taxable income into tax-free income,

If you are a sole proprietor, partner or S corporation owner, you'll be able to withdraw cash from your retirement plan AFTER Dec. 31, 2001 in the form of a nontaxable loan if you meet certain requirements; delay such loans until then for a better deal.

There will be new, liberalized limits relating to adoption expenses beginning in 2002. Where possible, delay incurring expenses relating to adoption in 2001 for better tax advantages.

Taxpayers who are eligible for the post-2001 tax credit for retirement savings should avoid taking distributions from qualified plans. The distribution may be taxable, and taking the distribution now may cause the loss of a tax credit worth 10, 20 or even 50 cents on the dollar.

Taxpayers who may be looking for tax credits, deductions and other tax benefits should try to reduce their Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) for 2001.

Holiday Safety

Happy Holidays, everyone! We've reached the last big holiday week of the year, relatives are on your doorstep, and you're already planning what to do for New Year's Eve.

If you are hosting extended family or friends this week, remember just a few things to make their visit more comfortable and safe:

Test the smoke and carbon monoxide detectors throughout the house to make sure they work (I know, you did this back in October, but it never hurts to check again).

Open up guest rooms before visitors arrive. Make sure the heating vents are open; if the air seems a bit stale, open the windows for an hour before opening the vents. Stock extra blankets and pillows in each room.

■ If you use space heaters, strictly observe safety rules. Keep the heater out of reach of children, off the floor and several feet away from clothing, blankets or curtains. Make sure the room is well-ventilated — in fact, it's far better to have a slight chill in a room than stuffy heat.

Secure the gate around your fireplace so that small children can't open it; put matches and kindling on the mantel, out of reach.

Collect all candles or lanterns and put them away while your visitors are there. If the power goes out, bring out the lanterns; otherwise, don't tempt children.

Designate a smoking area before the party or

visit, and place at least one ashtray there. Cover up unused electrical outlets.

■ In cold climates, keep a bag of sand or cat litter in the garage, in case the driveway and walkways ice up.

Meantime, keep your chin up, take a deep breath, and enjoy a house packed with family and friends this season!

If you've got some leftover holiday cash or you received a bookstore gift certificate for Christmas, consider adding a home-improvement book to your toolshelf. Quite a few manuals are out there.

The newest book on my shelf comes from Black & Decker. "The Complete Photo Guide to Home Repair" (Creative Publishing International, \$34.95) gives instructions on more than 300 home-repair issues, and illustrates them step-by-step with full-color photographs. This is a fantastic reference to have on-hand, especially if you're new to the do-it-yourself club.

Supplement this with the highly useful "The Home Owner's Journal: What I Did & When I Did It" by Colleen Jenkins (Blue Sky Marketing, \$11.95). The journal allows you to record, in detail, home repairs and improvements you've made. This fourth edition was released last year, but I've found it so indispensable that I picked up copies for family and friends this Christmas.

HOME TIP

Attach an inexpensive wrench to your gas meter — one that fits the cutoff valve. In an emergency, you'll be able to stop gas from entering your home much more quickly.

very carefully, and they never quite understood what I did in life," says the journalist once dubbed "the most trusted man in America" with a chuckle. "When I told them that I was the host for the U.S. broadcast of this Vienna concert, they suddenly looked at me with awe, because they figured I must be somebody important in my country."

Americans watching the concert this year may do so in a new light following the tragedies of September, particularly in light of the profound outpouring of support and sympathy that came from other countries around the world. U.S. viewers may identify more strongly now as part of a global community, especially since this year's holiday doesn't offer the neat sense of out-with-the-old, inwith-the-new that has characterized past years.

"(In) All New Year's (celebrations), we look ahead and hope that things are going to be better than in the past," Cronkite says. "That's the nature of the New Year's resolutions that many people make: to turn over a new leaf and do

things differently. Even when it's been a pretty good year just past, we all hope that the new year will be even better.

"This year, there will be a feeling of 'I hope we can put this all behind us,' but that won't be possible, of course. We don't knowwhat the new year's headlines are going to tell us about the ongoing war on terrorism. I don't see any hope that we will be out of Afghanistan (by the end of December), so I think we aren't going to be able to turn our backs entirely on this horror."

On a final and distinctively different holiday note, MTV is partnering with the United Service Organization and Armed Forces Entertainment to present a concert event for U.S. forces abroad.

Jennifer Lopez, Kid Rock and Ja Rule are scheduled to perform in For the Troops: MTV's USOShowairing NewYear's Day. Carson Daly is host for the program, which takes place at an undisclosed military base overseas and includes coverage of the artists interacting casually with the troops as well as actual performance footage.
