

County population shrinks in latest census

Prestonsburg grows by 54; prison boosts Wheelwright

The numbers are beginning to trickle in and, for the most part, Floyd County's figores are falling.

The U.S. Census Bureau has begun releasing location-specific data from the 2000 census, and the numbers show Floyd

County's population fell slightly from from 32,407 to 31,044.

According to the census, Floyd County's population now stands at 42,441. which is down 1,145 from 1990's 43,586.

All of that loss and more can be attributed to a decrease in residents under the age of 18. The number of minors in Floyd County fell by 1,363 during the 1990s,

That same trend could also be seen in most of the county's five incorporated cities, with Prestonsburg posting the only real gain during the 1990s.

Prestonsburg's population increased just slightly, rising 54 people from 3,558 in 1990 to 3,612 in 2000.

The city of Wheelwright showed the

largest population increase of the county's five cities, but the rise was deceptive. Wheelwright showed a gain of 321 people, rising from 721 in 1990 to 1,042 in 2000.

However, Wheelwright's population gain came as a result of the construction of Otter Creek Correctional Center during the 1990s, with inmates of the prison counted as residents of Wheelwright. Depending on how many prisoners were counted,

Cleanup worker crushed by tree

Witnesses sav man killed after saving coworker

A Floyd County man was killed yesterday at Price while working on the Left Beaver Creek cleanup effort.

Moses Pete Moore, 61, of Price, was working on the cleanup project yesterday afternoon behind the residence of Brian Hughes at McCreary

Branch when a tree fell on him at approximately 1:35 p.m.

During an attempt to cut down a tree, Moore fell victim to what could have been a possible oversight or, on the other hand, simple, unfortunate circumstance and timing.

According to accounts given, a deadened tree broke in half, sending the top half down onto Moore

Witnesses at the scene described Moore's final act as one of heroism, saying he pushed coworker and friend Terry Wayne Collins out of the way of the falling tree.

Seven schools to split \$201,668

Times Staff Report

Seven Floyd County schools will share in over \$200,000 in reward money based on their performance on statewide test-

The schools are among 702 statewide receiving awards totaling \$22.4 million.

The rewards are based on shares of about \$959, with each school having shares equal to the number of full-time certified employees.

Under that formula, Prestonsburg High School will receive the most money, with \$40,488.98 going to that school.

Other schools receiving rewards and the amount the will receive include:

Prestonsburg Elementary, \$36,346.10

Osborne Elementary, \$28,319,27

McDowell Elementary,

\$27,379,45 May Valley Elementary

\$25,739,56 Duff Elementary, \$24.818.92

Ciark Elementary. \$18,575,83 The schools are eligible for

the reward money because they met or exceeded performance goals on the Kentucky Core Content Test.

Schools will begin receiving their rewards by mid-April and each school will determine how to spend its money. Each school's site-based council is charged deciding how the rewards will be spent.

According to a statement sent out by the state Department of Education, reward money can be used "to purchase materials, to provide training, as teacher bonuses or in other appropriate ways to encourage school and student achievement."







The poll, commissioned by 'Check Your Child,' a public education initiative sponsored by Medtronic Sofamor Danek, a leader in the development of products used in the treatment of spinal disorders, found that only 20 percent of parents in America are aware of a simple screening test that can be conducted at

Scoliosis is a condition that may go virtually unnoticed in some children, but in others can impair the person's ability to walk, sit or lie comfortably.

It affects teenagers and adults and is more frequent (two percent) in females than in males (0.5 percent). The onset of symptoms usually occurs around the onset of puberty.

Early detection is important and a simple exam, called the 'Adam's Forward Bend Test,' can help detect the unnatural curvature of the spine.

Used by pediatricians, in school screenings or at home, the child is asked to lean forward with feet together, bending 90 degrees at the waist. If a curve is present, the child's shoulder blades will appear uneven. One may be higher than the other one.

Once scoliosis of the spine is detected, it can be confirmed with an X-ray, spinal radiograph, CT scan

Younger children should be checked using the Adam's Forward Bend Test every six to nine months from fifth grade through adolescence.

Various treatments, including orthopedic bracing and surgery can correct or lessen the degree of scolio-

Before recommending a treatment plan, a doctor will consider the severity of the curvature, location of the curve, maturity of the spine, and potential for pro-

Trash burner could get local support

Recycling Solutions Technologies' proposed waste gasification/thermal oxidation cell. also referred to simply as a garbage plant or trash cooker, that will be tested in roughly two weeks in Martin County may be in trouble regardless of how test results turn

There have been concerns lately of the environmental repercussions of the plant but, often in the background of discussions, there is a concern for acquiring more business for the plant so that it can be profitable.

The finished plant has a maximum capacity to handle 25 tons of garbage per day. John Burke, spokesman for RST and a Prestonsburg resident, has stated that in order to make the plant profitable it would need to handle up to 200 tons per day.

Prestonsburg Mayor Jerry Fannin may give RST a start toward gaining more business after recent talks proposing the possibility of Prestonsburg trash, presently being handled by Waste Management, to be sent to the Inez

"Yeah there are possibilities that we will do business with them," Fannin said on Monday. "It's all according to what we see when they come up with the prices. A good factor is it's not going to be going to a landfill this

Garbage handled at the newlyconstructed plant will go through an innovative process that would convert the trash into, for example, an ash that could then be recycled and used for such things as mixture for concrete blocks. Glass components within trash sent to the plant would be crushed and added to the ash so that nothing is left unused.

"All of it's usable," Fannin said. "I believe there are only a few in the world like it, maybe only one other like it in the world.

Although the exact prices were not disclosed to Fannin in terms of the costs for dealing with the garbage plant, Fannin feels the costs will be within a reasonable range and perhaps save the city of Prestonsburg money.

"The plant told us that they would keep the prices at or below what we are paying Waste Management now," Fannin said.

The city of Prestonsburg presently deals with Waste Management, who hauls the city's trash to a landfill in Lily, in Laurel County, at a cost of \$32 a ton.

Another possibility, of course, would be the question of whether or not Floyd County as a whole would do business with the Martin county plant.

That question is viable because, considering the 200 tons a day needed to make the plant profitable, which would obviously include building more plants at a cost that is not being disclosed to the news media at this time, it is important to note that Martin County only produces eight tons a

The amount must then be increased by a multiple of 192 tons to achieve the desired 200-ton capacity, which would mean taking on trash from other counties.

Floyd County Judge-Executive Paul Hunt Thompson said that Floyd County has taken a "sideline" approach to considerations of doing business with the new plant, but contract obligations also guide the possibility of Floyd County not redirecting its trash.

"Right now we're just on the sidelines observing," Thompson said during a brief interview on Monday, "I'm familiar with the system and have looked at it, but of course, we have a contract with Waste Management. I think there's two or three more years on that contract and we'll abide by it just as we would want them to abide by

Floyd County's current contract with Waste Management is for \$34 a ton hauled to the out-of-county Jandfill.

Thompson stated that there had been some discussion about the new plant, but that nothing had been decided. His more pressing concern was for the visible trash

throughout the county. "We're still pushing to get the garbage picked up," Thompson continued. "Frankly I don't care if it goes in a landfill or in a trash cooker, I just want to get it out of the creeks and the roads."



Strategy needed to lure out-of-state students

When an airplane takes off with an empty seat, it loses the opportunity for needed revenue. The same is true of colleges and universities when they have open seats in a classroom.

The difference is that there are reasons to get students into college other than paying the bills of the university. They are there to learn so they can someday apply that knowledge to the business world and as members of a community - preferably a Kentucky community.

Only 53 percent of Kentucky high school students seek further education upon graduation ... compared to the national average of 67 percent. Kentucky's goal is to meet that national average by 2020, which will take an additional 80,000 students.

More bad news is that of those 53 percent, not all of them stay in Kentucky upon graduation, especially if the state does not offer the type of quality job they seek.

One way of offsetting those losses is to recruit quality out-ofstate students.

That is the recommendation of a study by the Southern Technology Council, which studied the migration patterns of engineering and science graduates since 1998. Although native students are 10 times more likely to remain in the state upon college graduation compared to out-of-state students, the study found that a significant number of nonresidential students do remain in the state to find work.

Most of Kentucky's public universities try to entice nonresidential students from bordering states to come to the commonwealth by offering a discount on the higher out-of-state tuition rate. If that is an attempt to bring new talent into the state, it is a good move, said Gordon Davies, president of the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education. If it is merely to fill seats and bring in more tuition dollars, it is not.


That is because every student in a Kentucky public university is supplemented by \$6,000 to \$8,000 from state taxpayers, Davies said. Supplementing students who are not Kentuckians and who may add little to the state's economy once they graduate is not a wise use of tax dollars, he said.

That is why Kentucky needs to develop a policy for universities to seek only those nonresidential students who will possibly add to the state's talent pool, Davies said. "I do not know a place in Kentucky where there is an adequate supply of nurses," he said, so perhaps a policy would encourage enticements to attract nursing students.

Next year, the council wants to take a one-year and four-year look at how many recent college graduates stay in Kentucky, to help guide that policy decision, Davies said.

Kentucky's main emphasis should remain on improving its own on-to-college rate, but a clear strategy is needed to find the best way to attract talent from out of state and keep it here.

Wildlife Commission has set dates for the 2001-02 deer season and proposed fishing regulations for March 2002, The Commission recommends all boating, fishing and hunting regulations to the General Assembly and approves all expenditures of the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources (KDFWR).

Zone changes for the 2001-2001 deer season include

The Kentucky Fish and Butler, Edmonson, Grayson, special season. This adds two and out daily. They must check Hart and Metealfe counties to be moved from Zone 2 to Zone 3. Breckinridge County will move from Zone 1 to Zone 2 and Owsley County will move from Zone 3 to Zone 4. All other county zones will remain the same.

The commission approved that hunters who have not reached their 18th birthday by the start of Youth Deer Hunt Weekend may hunt during that

years of eligibility for youth to participate in the October youth-only gun season. Age requirements for adult hunting and fishing licenses did not change. The under 16 age requirement for quota youth hunts on Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) also remains the same.

Hunters participating in a KDFWR WMA quota hunt are no longer required to check in in at the beginning and out at the conclusion of the hunt. Check station hours for quota hunts in 2001-2002 will be noon-8 p.m. local time the day preceding the hunt and from 4:30 a.m.-7 p.m. in the central zone and 5:30 a.m.-8 p.m. in the eastern zone on hunt days. Green River WMA is now considered wholly in the eastern

■ A slot limit of 12-15 inches on smallmouth and largemouth bass at Paintsville Lake ■ The 20-inch minimum size

limit and one-fish daily creel limit for brown trout will include

all tributary streams of the

Cumberland River from Wolf

Creek Dam to the Tennessee line ■ The trout waters of Otter Creek inside the Fort Knox Military Reservation and Otter Creek Park shall be placed under delayed harvest regulations. All trout caught between October 1 through March 31 shall be released and anglers may only use artificial lures and flies during this period.

■ The boundary of Nolin River Lake will extend to Wheelers Mill Road in the Nolin River arm and to the Hwy. 728 bridge in Bacon Creek.

■ There will be a 10-fish daily limit with no more than five fish of the daily limit longer than 15 inches or longer for white bass, vellow bass, striped bass and their hybrids at Taylorsville Lake. The upper boundary of Taylorsville Lake will be Dry Dock Road on Salt River.

■ There will be a 15-inch minimum size with a one-fish daily creel limit on largemouth bass and a 4-fish daily creel limit on channel catfish on four ponds on Taylorsville Lake WMA that

open to fishing in March, 2003. ■ A 16-inch minimum size limit will apply for smallmouth bass on Cave Run Lake and a 15inch minimum size limit for largemouth bass on Lake Jericho.

■ A 12-15 slot limit for largemouth and smallmouth bass will apply at Fagan Branch Lake (Lebanon City Lake). All other special regulations for other species will be removed to follow state regulations.

A three-fish daily creel limit for largemouth bass on Lake Reba in Richmond and a 15-inch minimum size limit for largemouth bass on General Butler State Park Lake.

Proposed fishing regulations for Cedar Creek lake in Lincoln County:

15-inch minimum size limit and 3-fish daily limit on largemouth bass; nine-inch minimum size limit and a 15-fish daily limit on crappie; 30-fish daily limit on bluegill and redear sunfish (shellcrackers); 4-fish daily limit on channel catfish; possession or use of shad for bait will be prohibited.

"Legends of the Last Century, with Chaplin," recreates the hilarious antics of Charlie Chaplin during the silent movie era through innovative dance moves and stage designs rendered in black, white, and gray.

NEWS of the Weird

- At least 1,400 college students are majoring in "golf" at eight universities, with more schools about to start programs. according to a March Wall Street Journal report. One school just completed a \$1.1 million student "learning laboratory" (that is, a model golf clubhouse), part of what is necessary to meet the demand for pros as new or expanded U.S. courses open at the rate of about one a day. Curricula include business classes, turf science, and many, many rounds of golf.

- According to police reports on March 3 (the first day of sale of the \$125 Nike Air Jordan Retro XI sneakers), shoe stores in Detroit, Milwaukee, Columbus, Ohio, and Peoria, Ill., needed officers to quell actual or budding customer violence because of insufficient supplies of the shoes, and in Sacramento, Calif., and Toledo, Ohio, entire malls had to be shut down as consumers threatened to take their frustrations out on Foot Locker and other stores.

Names in the News

The ex-student suing the Oklahoma University law school for expelling him (who announced in January he would appeal to the state supreme court): Mr. Perry Mason. The 58-year-old man arrested for exposing himself in the front window of a business in Nashua, N.H., in December: Mr. Joseph Dangle. The 25-year-old woman arrested in West Haven, Conn., in September for spitting on a police officer and then urinating in his patrol car: Ms. Lonna Leak. A high-school track-andfield star in Staten Island, N.Y., noted in a January issue of Sports Illustrated: Mr. I-Perfection Harris.

Government in Action

- A Los Angeles Police Department report released in January revealed that, because of high turnover of operators and slowdowns in construction of new 911 facilities, a total of 219,733 calls to 911 last year were never answered by an operator, which, even when discounted by the 80 percent that are nonemergencies, averages to 120 emergency calls ignored each day.

- In February, Ohio prison officials sent the state finance board the preliminary medical bill for correcting a convicted murderer's severe nosebleed: \$160,303 (but final costs are expected to be added). The man, who is serving 15 years to life, is a hemophiliac who asked for surgery to correct chronic sinusi-

- Federal marshals seized the Indianapolis Baptist Temple in February for back taxes, 91 days after church leaders and parishioners began occupying it in a vigil and 16 years after it began refusing to deduct withholding and Social Security taxes from employees' paychecks. The church's position on taxes, that it is governed only by God's law, was consistently rejected by courts over the years and finally by the U.S. Supreme Court in January. But in Norwich, Conn., Salvatore Verdirome said he plans no such protest as the state property tax people zero in on his Sanctuary of Love, a hillside field of 47 sky-blue bathtubs that form shelters for statues of the Virgin Mary, and on which he owes more than \$100,000 in back taxes and utility bills for the last 30 years.

The Cash Value of Hurt Feelings

Raymond Jones filed a complaint after having angrily stalked off his job during the 1998 holiday season, never to return, at a Shoppers Drug Mart in Vancouver, British Columbia, because his boss told him to set up artificial poinsettias in a seasonal display, which he took as a directive to support the abhorrent idea of "Christmas" (he is a Jehovah's Witness). And the very petite Brenda Marshall said a constable in St. John's, Newfoundland, violated her civil rights as a short person by stopping her car, believing an underage child was driving. (Results: Mr. Jones won a \$30,000 judgment from the province's human rights panel in January; Ms. Marshall lost in the province's court of appeals in January.)

Also, in the Last Month ...

A wind-blown skydiver landed on a woman serving beer during a Daytona Beach Bike Week event at which women wrestle in a vat of cole slaw, sending the woman to the hospital for three days. A homeowner forked over \$40,000 to have his house lifted and moved three feet back to comply with a zoning rule (Snohomish County, Wash.). A Hoover, Ala., BP gas station owner, chasing after a customer who skipped out on a \$20 fill-up, stayed with him at high speeds down Interstate 65 and U.S. 231 for 130 miles before finally giving up. Though he had not fought since July 1999 and in fact passed away in October 2000, boxer Darrin Morris advanced in the latest (January 2001) World Boxing Organization super-middleweight rankings, from 11th to

RITTER**CORNER**

With spring on the way, it's time to make sure that your dog is

up to date on his heartworm preventative.

Heartworms are exactly what they sound like - large white worms that grow up to a foot long and live in the heart and surrounding blood vessels of dogs and other animals. There are a lot of misconceptions about the life cycle, prevention and treatment of these parasites. When I first started practice back in the early 80's there was even a rumor that veterinarians had made them up to drum up business! (Trust me, if we had invented them, we would have come up with something easier to treat.) This week, we'll review a little parasitology. Heartworm disease is mainly a problem of dogs, but cat owners, don't tune out!

The scientific name of the heartworm is Dirofilaria immitis (which means "evil threadworm" according to a brochure put out by the Kentucky Veterinary Medical Association). This is a good description of the adult heartworm. They look very similar to the roundworms you see sometimes in the stool of puppies and kitens, and in fact they are distantly related, but their life cycles are completely different. The adults live primarily in the right side of he heart and in the nearby blood vessels, including the pulmonary arteries that supply blood to the lungs.

Adult heartworms produce microscopic-size larvae, called microfilariae, which circulate in the bloodstream. A mosquito can pick up these larvae when it takes blood from an infected dog. They continue to develop inside the mosquito for about two weeks, and then move into the mouthparts of the insect. When the mosquito feeds on another dog, the larvae move from the mosquito into the dog. It takes about six months from the time a dog becomes infected for the heartworms to mature and migrate to the dog's heart. The new adult heartworms begin to produce microfilariae, and the cycle begins all over.

Heartworm also affects cats, although it is not as common in this species. A recent article in the Lexington Herald-Leader discussed this problem, and reported that the incidence in cats is estimated to be as high as 17% in Kentucky. I honestly don't know what the prevalence of feline heartworm disease is in this area. With their smaller heart and blood vessel size, it isn't surprising that even a few worms can cause major problems in a cat. Don't be surprised if your veterinarian soon begins recommending testing and preventative medication for your cat.

are variable, ranging from no symptoms at all to sudden death. In general, however, an affected dog will cough, lose weight, tire easily, and may develop a distended abdomen. Affected cats are more likely to show less specific signs such as vomiting, res-

piratory difficulty, and lethargy. Now that you understand the basic biology of these parasites, it is easier to explain how heartworm disease is diagnosed. There are two basic ways we can try to detect the presence of heartworms: we can look for the microfilariae or we can look for the adult worms.

Up until a few years ago we pretty much had to rely on tests that looked for the microfilariae. The simplest test is to use a microscope to look for moving larvae in a drop of blood. Concentration tests, such as the Modified Knott's Test, involve passing a blood sample through a microscopic filter to increase the odds of finding microfilariae. Stain applied to the filtered sample makes the larvae easier to see.

There are some limitations to these tests, however. For one thing, about 40% of heartworminfected dogs have "occult" disease; there are no microfilariae present. This can be due to several things: All the adult worms present can be of the same sex and therefore producing no larvae, or there can be so few adults that there are not enough microfilariae to detect. In some cases scientists believe that the dog's body can become so sensitized

Another problem with these tests is the existence of a second microfilaria (Dipetelonema reconditum), which never devel ops into a large worm, but can be confusing when it is presen because it looks so much like the real thing.

A much more accurate tes looks for certain proteins (o "antigens") that are present in the adult heartworm. This tes has been available for a while but in recent years it has been improved so that it can be run it the veterinarian's office in just few minutes. This test relies on a color change-similar to over the counter pregnancy tests-to indicate the presence or absence of adult heartworms, so they are very easy to read. Antigen tests are reliable: built-in positive and negative controls minimize the likelihood of false positive and false negative results, and they are sensitive enough to pick up the presence of just a few worms. Only a few drops of blood are needed to run the test. They are somewhat more expensive than the older tests to run, but are generally twenty dollars or less-worth it, in my opinion, for their increased accuracy.

Next time, we'll discuss the prevention and treatment of heartworm disease.
