

Lexington, Ky., Feb. 17. Slightly more than 72,000,000 tons of coal were shipped in Kentucky during 1930. A decrease of 8,000,000 tons from the 1929 output according to information made public by John F. Dand, chief of the Kentucky Department of Mines, with offices here. That figure is 153,000 tons less than the coal output of the state in 1929, as compared with 187 for 1928. PRIMARY VS. CONVENTION

With the state election in the offing, talk naturally drifts into a discussion of the merits or faults of the primary or convention methods of selecting standardbearers of the two major parties.

The matter reduces itself to an attempt to choose the lesser of two evils. Whichever method is adopted there will be the usual chicanery practised, the same rotten politics played, and there will be a disgruntled element...

The only endorsement to be given the primary system is that it at least gives the common people the chance to express themselves. The primary of today is, at any rate, reminiscent of the earliest and purest democracy known to man.

In the convention the votes will be counted as they are cast, but whose votes are they? This much of principle the convention adheres to, but what of the matter of a party casting those votes? A rather cold-blooded affair in most cases, the convention. Delegates eye with favor the man most likely to win, be his qualifications never so poor; the sentiments of the folks back home will not matter so much after all when the first few ballots are taken and hope is lost for local favorites.

FIGURES DON'T LIE

If the people of this country are gullible enough to take the figures given out by Secretary Mellon and President Hoover in their uncompromising opposition to the soldiers' bonus bill, a lot of us are going to become disillusioned.

We're going to get the idea out of our heads that the Stars and Stripes wave over the richest country on the globe. We'll be obliged to decide that America could not have continued, as a participant in the World War longer than ten more days! Here's why: If seventy-five per cent. of the ex-service men should take advantage of the bill and accept fifty per cent. of their bonus, certificates in cash, the cost to this country would be approximately \$1,000,000,000, to quote Secretary Mellon himself.

The public is long-suffering, but it will not—it cannot—be "taken in" on any such figures as those stated by the administration. We know that America was in the World War to fight to the last ditch, that it was able to fight. Moreover, we know that, were it necessary, we could do the same again. We could spend billions in another destructive war, but, according to the administration's figures, we cannot pay our bills.


